ORD PANMURE has this day received a Despatch and its Enclosures, of which the following are copies, addressed to His Lordship by Field-Marshal the Lord Raglan, G.C.B.

> Before Sevastopol, May 1, 1855.

I HAVE little to report to your Lordship

to-day.

MY LORD,

The Russians continue actively engaged in covering their advanced works, and they have constructed a new battery on their left of the Mamelon; troops are constantly in motion on the north side, and there is every appearance of the establishment of a very large camp on the plateau above the Balbek, extending towards Mackenzie's Farm.

No movement has been perceived on the Tchernaya.

I have the satisfaction to acquaint your Lordship, that the 3rd Regiment or Buffs has arrived at Balaklava, and that the Alma, having the draft of the Guards on board, reached Kazutch Bay yesterday; she has proceeded to Balaklava to-day. I inclose the lists of casualties to the 29th
