**L**ORD PANMURE has this day received a Despatch and its Enclosures, of which the following are copies, addressed to His Lordship by Field-Marshal the Lord Raglan, G.C.B.

MY LORD,

*Before Sevastopol,  
May 19, 1855.*

I DO myself the honour to inclose the list of casualties that occurred between the 14th and 17th instant.

For the last two days there has been hardly any firing on either side; large convoys have come into Sevastopol from the northern side, but there has been no movement of importance.

The heat has been very oppressive since Wednesday.

I deeply regret to have to report that I have just received a letter from General Osten Sacken, in answer to an enquiry I addressed to him on the subject, informing me that Captain Arnold, of the 4th Regiment of Foot, who was wounded and taken prisoner on the night of the 5th, died that same night.
