PRESENT.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners VV for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled "An Act for carry-"ing into effect the reports of the Commissioners "appointed to consider the state of the Esta-"blished Church in England and Wales, with "reference to Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues, "so far as they relate to Episcopal Dioceses, "Revenues, and Patronage," and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain " modifications, the fourth report of the Commis-"sioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain "and amend two several Acts relating to the "Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fourteenth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, in the words and figures following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled 'An Act for carrying into effect the reports of the Commissioners appointed to consider the state of the Established Church in England and Wales, with reference to Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues, so far as they relate to episcopal dioceses, revenues, and patronage, and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament, held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues,' and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England,' have prepared and now

humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for substituting a money payment to the Bishop of London for an estate belonging to his sec.

"Whereas it was by the secondly and thirdly recited Acis enacted, that, by the authority therein provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same), and for the purpose of fully carrying into effect any of the provisions of the same Acis, or of the said first recited Act, any arrangements might from time to time be made, with the consent in writing under the corporate seal of any bishop, for the sale, transfer, or exchange of any lands, tithes, or other hereditaments belonging to the see of such bishop, or for the purchase of other lands, tithes, or other hereditaments in lien thereof, or for substituting in any case any lands, tithes, or other hereditaments for any money payment, or any money payment for any lands, tithes, or other hereditaments.

"And whereas the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Charles James, Bishop of London, is seised, in right of his see, of the lands, tenements, and hereditaments, particularly described in the schedule hereto annexed, subject, nevertheless, to a subsisting lease thereof, bearing date the thirty-first day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight, granted for three lives, of which only one survives, and is now aged sixty-three years or thereabouts, at annual reserved rents, amounting together to seven pounds, thirteen shillings, and sixpence.

"And whereas the said Charles James, Bishop of London, is now entitled to grant a renewal of the said lease by the insertion therein of two additional lives, and it has been represented to us by the said bishop that the lessee is desirous of taking such renewal, but that it is not expedient to grant the same.

And whereas after full inquiry and calculation we have estimated the fine which ought to be paid for such renewal at the sum of three thousand three hundred pounds, and the sums which after full stating the existing lease the bishop and his successors might have expected to have derived from the before-mentioned annual reserved rents and from future fines upon renewals as equivalent

to an annuity of forty-five pounds.

"And whereas one of the purposes of the said Acts is to provide a fund for making better provision for the cure of souls, and we are of opinion that it would ultimately conduce to the improve-

ment of the said fund, that the said lands, tenements, and hereditaments should be transferred from the said See of London to us, and that a money payment to the said Charles James, Bishop of London, should forthwith be substituted for his interest in the same.

"And whereas the said bishop has consented to accept a money payment accordingly, and that the same shall be the sum of three thousand three hundred pounds, being the amount of such fine as aforesaid, together with an annual sum of forty-five pounds to himself and to his successors in respect of the sums which he and they might have expected to have received from future renewals and from the reserved rents hereinbefore mentioned, and thereupon to relinquish all further benefit by renewal of the said lease or otherwise in respect of the said lands, tenements, and hereditaments.

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the said Right Honourable and Right Reverend Charles James, Bishop of London, testified by his having signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal, that from and after the day of the due publication in the London Gazette of an Order of your Majesty in Council, ratifying this scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly Gazetted Order, the lands, tenements, and hereditaments particularly described and set forth in the schedule hereto annexed shall be and become conveyed and transferred from the said bishop and his successors, Bishops of London, and shall be absolutely vested in us for the purposes of the said hereinbefore recited Acts.

"And we further recommend and propose, that as part consideration for the transfer to us of such lands, tenements, and hereditaments as aforesaid, there shall at the same time be paid by us to the said Charles James, Bishop of London, his executors, administrators, or assigns, the aforesaid sum of three thousand three hundred pounds; and that there shall, as a further consideration, be paid by us to the said Charles James, Bishop of London, and to his successors in the said see, the said annual sum of forty-five pounds by equal half-yearly payments, the first of such half-yearly payments to be made at the expiration of six months from the date of such Order being gazetted as aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matter aforesaid, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing scheme has reference:—

"All that and those, the several pieces or parcels of land, comprising together one hundred and ten acres, three roods, and six perches, little more or less, situate in the parishes of Hornsey and Finchley, in the county of Middlesex, with the rights, members, and appurtenances thereto belonging, all which are now in the tenure of the Right Honourable the Earl of Mansfield or his undertenants, by virtue of a certain indenture of lease, bearing date the thirty-first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight, and made between the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Charles James, Bishop of London, of the one part, and Edward Robert Butler, Esquire, of the other part."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said

Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of London.

HEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act of Parliament, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an "Act passed in the last session of Parliament "for building and promoting the building of "additional churches in populous parishes," and of the third section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament, held in the second and third years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the as-" assignment of ecclesiastical districts to churches " or chapels augmented by the Governors of the "bounty of Queen Anne, and for other pur-"poses," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twelfth day of June, one thousand eight hundred. and fifty-five, in the words following; viz.:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Saint Paul, Bristol, in the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, it appears to them to be expedient that a particular district. should be assigned to the consecrated church of Saint Clement, situate in the said parish of Saint Paul, Bristol, under the powers contained in the sixteenth section of an Act of Parliament, passed in the fiftyninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled 'An Act to amend and ' render more effectual an Act passed in the last 'session of Parliament for building and pro-'moting the building of additional churches in po-' pulous parishes,' as enlarged by the third section of an Act of Parliament, passed in the second and third years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to make better provision for the assign-ment of ecclesiastical districts to churches or chapels, augmented by the Governors of the bounty of Queen Anne, and for other purposes, and that such proposed district should be named. 'The District Chapelry of Saint Clement, Bristol,' and that the boundaries thereof should be asfollow; that is to say:

"On the north-east by the boundary-line which separates the said parish of Saint Paul from the parish of Saint Barnabas, on the east, south-east, and south, by the boundary-line separating the said parish of Saint Paul from the parishes of Saint Jude and Saint Matthias, on the south-west by the boundary-line separating the said parish of Saint Paul from the parish of Saint James, as far as Milk-street, and on the north-west and north by the remaining part of the said parish of Saint Paul, from which the said district chapelry of Saint Clement, Bristol, is divided by a line pro-

ceeding easterly along the middle of Milk-street, to a small thoroughfare or entrance into a Timberyard, running in a north-westerly direction; then again easterly, round a new built dissenting chapel, into Regent-place; from thence along the bottom of the gardens belonging to houses on the south side of Saint James's-square, opposite to and across the top of Cherry Alley, and along a garden wall belonging to No. 15, Saint James's-square, across York-street, into a little lane through what is now a malthouse, in a direct line with that lane, into Gloucester-street; from thence north-westerly, up the middle of that street, as far as Norfolk-street; then proceeding north-easterly, along the middle of that street, across Pritchard-street, into Paulstreet; then south-easterly, along the middle of that street, to Orange-street, and along the middle of Orange-street to Lemon-lane; then north-westerly, along the middle of that lane, to a wall that separates the gardens and premises belonging to Wilson-street and Orange-street, and proceeding along that wall into Gideon-place; from thence, through a zigzag alley, into Wilson-street, and along the middle of Wilson-street, about fifty yards, in an easterly direction, to Windsor-terrace; then north-westerly, along a wall that separates Cross's Gardens on the east from gardens belonging to the church of Saint Paul on the west, to the north-eastern end of Bishop-street, and from this point, in a north-easterly direction, along a wall that separates Cross's Gardens on the south side from other gardens on the north, in a straight line to the point marked A, where the boundary of the said district chapelry of Saint Clement, Bristol, commenced, as the same is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereto annexed, and thereon coloured blue:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent that it also appears to them to be expedient that banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, and churchings should be solemnized or performed in the said church of Saint Clement, Bristol, and that the fees to arise therefrom should be paid and belong to the minister thereof for the

time being.

"That the consent of the Right Reverend James Henry, Bishop of the said diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, has been obtained thereto, as required by the Acts and sections hereinbefore mentioned, in testimony whereof he has signed

and sealed this representation.

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment of a district chapelry to Saint Clement's Church, Bristol, be accordingly made, and that the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns, and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, and churchings, in the said church, and the fees to arise therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts; and Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol.
