**CORD** PANMURE has this day received a Despatch and its Enclosures, of which the following are copies, addressed to his Lordship by General Simpson, Commanding Her Majesty's Forces in the East.

Before Sevastopol, July 28, 1855.

Since my Despatch of the 24th instant, I have nothing of importance to relate to you. We continue to strengthen and improve our advanced works, which are now so close to the enemy's defences, that I regret to say our casualties are necessarily considerable.

My LORD.

The enemy exhibit great activity in adding to and improving their defences, and the conveyance of large military stores from the north to the south side is increasing.

I beg to transmit the lists of ca-unlties to the 26th instant, and the confidential fortnight reports of the Generals of Division and Brigade.

The cholera has nearly ceased in the ranks of the Army.


