PRESENT.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament, held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect with certain modifications the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical duties and revenues," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the second day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, in the words following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical duties and revenues,' have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for augmenting the income of the Archdeaconry of Worcester, in the diocese of Worcester.

"Whereas it was by the said recited Act enacted that so soon as conveniently might be, and by the authority therein provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same), any archdeaconry might, subject to the consent of the bishop be endowed, amongst other modes, by augmentation out of the common fund in the same Act mentioned, but not so as in that case to raise the average annual income thereof to an amount exceeding two hundred pounds, with a proviso that no archdeacon should be entitled to hold any endowment or augmentation or other emolument as such archdeacon under the provisions of the same Act, unless resident for the space of eight months in every year within the diocese in which his archdeaconry should be situate, but subject to the same provisions as to licenses for non-residence which are enacted with respect to incumbents of benefices by the Act relating to pluralities and residence of the clergy in the same Act mentioned:

"And whereas by a scheme prepared and laid before your Majesty in Council by us, and ratified by an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing

date the third day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, and duly published in the London Gazette, it was provided, inter alia, that there should be paid by us, out of the common fund in the said recited Act mentioned, to the Venerable Richard Brindley Hone, the present Archdeacon of the said Archdeaconry of Worcester, and to his successors in the said archdeaconry, the annual sum of one hundred and thirty-six pounds:

"And whereas the amount of the said grant of one hundred and thirty-six pounds was fixed on the assumption that the average annual income of the said archdeaconry, arising from other sources, amounted to sixty-four pounds, and it has since been made to appear to us that such average annual income does not exceed the sum of forty-four pounds:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Worcester, testified by his having signed and sealed this scheme, that, in addition to the sum of one hundred and thirty-six pounds, in the hereinbefore recited scheme and Order mentioned, there shall be paid by us out of the common fund in the said Act mentioned, to the said Richard Brindley Hone, Archdeacon of Worcester, and to his successors in the said archdeaconry, so long as he or they shall respectively hold the same, the further annual sum of twenty pounds on the first day of May in every year, and that the first such additional payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May next, provided that every such payment shall be made only on production to us of a certificate from the bishop, that the archdeacon claiming the same has duly resided within the diocese of Worcester, during the preceding year, in accordance with the provisions of the said recited Act, or has been legally exempt from such residence.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act or of any other Act of Parliament.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law imme-

diately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Worcester.

Lighthouses on the Coasts of Spain on the Ocean.

THE Ministry of Marine has communicated to the Hydrographical Office, through the Ministry of Public Works, some data relative to the establishment of a new lighthouse, erected by the Corps of Engineers of roads, canals, and ports, according to which the following notice has been drawn up.

*Lighthouse on the Cape La Plata, at Pasages,
(Province of Guipuzcoa.)*

From the 1st of October next the above-mentioned lighthouse will be lighted every night; it is situated to the west of the Channel of Pasages, in 43° 20' 21" N. latitude, and 4° 48' 43" E. longitude from the Naval Observatory of San Fernando.

Its apparatus is of the fourth catadioptrical order, with a permanent light of natural color, and its range will be of about 14 miles, under favourable atmospheric circumstances.

The luminous focus stands at an elevation of 532 Castilian feet (148, 125 metres) above the level of equinoxial tides.

This publication is made for the purpose expressed at the beginning of this notice.

By the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament, passed in the 54th year of the reign of his late Majesty King George the Third, chapter 159, intituled "An Act for the better regulation of the several ports, harbours, roadsteads, sounds, channels, bays, and navigable rivers in the United Kingdom, and of His Majesty's docks, dockyards, arsenals, wharfs, moorings, and stores therein, and for repealing several Acts passed for that purpose," it is enacted (among other things) that no person or persons shall take any ballast or shingle from the shores or banks, or any portion of the shores or banks, of any port, harbour, or haven of this kingdom, from which the Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom for the time being shall find it necessary for the protection of such port, harbour, or haven, or the works thereof, by order, under their hands, or the hand of their Secretary, and published in the London Gazette, shall prohibit the taking or removing of such shingle or ballast upon pain of forfeiting for every such offence the sum of Ten Pounds.

And whereas we, as Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom, have found it necessary for the protection of the Harbour of Harwich, in the county of Essex, to prohibit the taking or removing of any ballast or shingle from the shores or banks or any portion of the shores or banks of the said harbour, between high and low water mark on that part of the foreshore, extending from the breakwater at Beacon Cliff, for one mile to southward. And we do therefore hereby order, that no

person or persons shall take or remove any ballast or shingle from such shores or banks, or any portion of such shores or banks of the said harbour before described.
