War-Department, September 21, 1855.

CRD PANMURE has this day received a Despatch and its Enclosures, of which the following are copies, addressed to his Lordship by General Simpson.

> Before Sevastopol, September 8, 1855.

My Lord, AT daylight on the 5th instant, the batteries of the Allied Armies opened a steady and continuous fire against the enemy's works.

During the night one of the vessels, supposed to be a frigate, stationed on the north side of the harbour, was set on fire by, it is believed, a shell from a French battery in their right attack. The firing, during the 6th, 7th, and up to the present moment, has continued uninterrupted, and but

feebly responded to by the Russians.

Another frigate was discovered yesterday afternoon to be on fire, and has been entirely destroyed. From the length of time it continued burning,

it is supposed to have contained stores.

About eleven o'clock last night a heavy explosion took place, but I have not as yet been able to ascertain in which part of the enemy's works.

I beg to enclose the list of casualties to the 6th instant.
