A PROCLAMATION For Proroguing of the Parliament.

AMES R.

Hereds Our Parliament begun and held at Westminster the Ninetechth day of May in the first year of Our Reign; was by Protogations continued to the Tench day of May last past, and was then serther Proregued to the Two and twentieth day of November next ensuing: And Our Royal Intension being to Prorogue Our said Parliament to a further day; and being willing for the great Ease of Our Lowing Subjeels, the Lords, Knighes, Citizens and Burgesses of Our faid Parliament, to dispence with their Attendance at Westminster at the day prefixe : We have thought fit, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to Publish and Declare Our Royal Well and Pleasure to be, that Our Suid Parliament be-Pronoqued from the faid Two and swentieth day of November news enfuing, to the Fifteenth day of February next enfi.ing, to be holden then at Westminster. And Our faid Parlidment is hereby Prorogued from the faid Two and twentieth day of November next enflished to the Fifteenth day of February next ensuing, to be held at Westminster. And Our Will and Pleasure w, and We do her by structly Require and Command Our said Lowing Subjects, the Lords, Knights, Citizens and Burgesses of Our suid Parliament, that accordingly they give their Attendance at Westmin-ster upon the fail Fifteenth day of February next ensiting, as they will Answer the contrary at their Perils.

Given at Our Court at Whitehall the Eighth day of October, 1686. in the Second Year of Our Reign.

Cadiz, Sept. 16.
