A PROCLAMATION

For Proroguing of the Parliament.

JAMES R.

Hereds Our Parliament begun and herd at Westminster the Ninetsenth day of May in the first year of Our Reign; was by Protogations continued to the Tenth day of May last past, and was then for-

ther Prorogued to the Two and twentieth day of November next enfuing : And Our Royal Intension being to Prorogue Our laid Parliament to a further day; and being willing for the great Eafe of Our Lowing Subjeels, the Lords, Knights, Citizens and Burgeffes of Our faid Parliament, to diffence with their Attendance at Weltminfter at the day prefixe ? We have thought fit, with the Advice of Onr Privy Council, to Publish and Declare Our Royal Well and Pleasure to be, that Our fuid Parliament be-Pronoqued from the fairl Two and swentieth day of November news enfuing, to the Fifteenth day of February next enfing, to be holden then at Westminster. And Our fard Parliament is bereby Prorogued from the Yaid Two and thentieth thay of November next 'enfilish to the Fisteenth day of February next 'enfining, to be held at Westminster. And Our Will and Pleafure 1. and We do her by frittly Require and Command Our faid Loving Subjects, the Lords, Knights, Citizens and Burgeffes of Our find Parliament, that accordingly they give their Attendance at Weltmin-fter upon the fail Fifteenth day of February next enfiting, as they will Anfiver the contrary at their Perils.

Given at Our Court at Whitehall the Eighth day of October, 1686. in the Second Year of Our Reign.

Cadiz, Sept. 16. The 14th Instant arrived here the Galions in 64 days from the Havana; They were 22 in number when they came from Cartagena; but one was obliged to return thither, two remained empty at the Havana, and another was burnt at Sea, being very leaky, after the Goods had been taken out of her.

Madrid, Sept. 26. The 14th Inftant the Galions 18 in number, arrived at Cadiz, under the Convoy of 26 Men of War; They were forced in the voyage to fot fire to the Galion called San Salvador, the being very leaky, after having taken out the Silver and the beft Merchandifes, but the Cacao, the Cochenille, and some other goods were lost, to the value of about 200000 Crowns. The 18th, Te Deum was fung here for the taking of Buda, and the publick. Rejoycing on this occasion continued 3 days. Dantzick, Sept. 28. They write from Poland that the Molcowites have taken Percallan on the other fide of the Nieper by Affault, putting all the Tarters that were in Garilon there to the iword.

Vienna, Sept. 30. We are told from Buda that the Workmen, in clearing the Ruines of the Forti-fications, have found under the Rondels of the Callle two great Mines, and a third under the Walls of the Town, which reached under one of our Batteries, all three charged. That they had for the prefent fecured the Breaches with Palifadoes; and were making provision of the necessary Materials for the repairing the Walls to foon as the featon will permit.
