Mersey Conservancy Notice.

IN accordance with the provisions of an Act of Parliament, made and passed in the fifth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for better preserving the navigation of the River Mersey," the Commissioners acting in the execution of the several Acts of Parliament for the improvement of Birkenhead and Claughton-cum-Grange, in the county of Chester, do hereby give you notice, that the said Commissioners propose to make, construct, and erect quays, wharves, breasts, and embankments in or adjoining to the River Mersey, and which will extend beyond the line of the high water mark of a tide uninfluenced by the wind, of the height of twenty-one feet, as measured from the top of the cill of the gates of the Old Dock, in Liverpool, being the datum in the said Act mentioned; and that such quays, wharves, breasts, and embankments are intended to be made, constructed, and erected in front of land belonging to the said Commissioners at a certain place called Monksferry, in Birkenhead aforesaid, and lying between the south side of the Monksferry Landing-slip and the proposed wall forming the northern boundary of the works now in the course of execution by the Liverpool Corporation, in a straight line, or nearly so, from north to south between the said places, and in length 197 feet, or thereabouts, and extending into the said River Mersey beyond the line of high water mark of a tide of 21 feet, uninfluenced by as aforesaid, and measured as aforesaid, 215 feet, or thereabouts, in the widest part thereof, and 67 feet, or thereabouts, in the narrowest part thereof, such difference of width arising from the irregularities of the present line of high water mark; and further, that the front of such quays, wharves, breasts, and embankments to the said river are proposed to be stone walls, the backs thereof being filled and levelled up with rock, stones, earth, and other proper materials, and the object thereof is to provide wharves and

landing-places for the accommodation of the said ferry and conveniences for the repairing of ships and other purposes; and that the said Commissioners intend to commence the erection and construction of the said works, at the expiration of two calendar months from the time at which this notice shall be sent to you, or at such earlier period as under the provisions of the said Act may be authorized.—Dated this fifteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six.
