Shawls—According to the tissues of which they may be composed, with the addition of 30 per cent., in the case of embroidered shawls, if the embroidery cover more than one-quarter of the surface, and of 60 per cent., if it cover more than three-quarters of the surface.

Wearing apparel (in packages of 25 kilog. in weight) rated according to the materials of which formed, deductions being made for the linings and accessories in articles not allowed drawback.

No articles of woollen thread or woollen tissue will be admitted to the drawback unless the amount of the drawback be at least 10f.

The above drawbacks are to be considered as applicable for six months from the date of the Decree (19th January, 1856).
