

Prince Louis of Prussia (who as we told you in our last, took in his march the Town of *Oppeln*) joined the 24th *Sept* near *Leunowitz* the Forces commanded by Lieutenant General *Scherff* &c. and the *Brn of Croatia* making together an Army of 24000 Men, and that the next day they intended to march to attack the *Castle of Five Churches*; The Town was plundered but not burnt, by the *Croats* when they made themselves Masters of it the 5th Instant. The Emperor has given the Regiment lately commanded by the *Marquis de la Vigne* to the Count *de Tilsitz*, who was his Lieutenant Colonel. The President of the Chamber of the *Finances*, who is come back from *Brada*, has reported to the Emperor, That all the Houses there are ruined, that it will require a great deal of time as well as Expence to repair them: That for the present the Governor has caused Barragues to be made, and several Houses, of those that had suffered the least damage, to be covered, to lodge the *Garrison*. That he has begun to fortify *St. Gerhards Hill*, which commands part of the Town. That there were still 2400 *Turkish* prisoners, and among these a great many Officers, 400 Children, and 100 Women. It has been proposed to exchange them for Christians that are in slavery, or else to sell them to the *Venetians* to serve in their Gallies. The Winter Quarters are its said settled in this manner; The Infantry of *Bavaria*, *Franconia* and *Saxonia* are to winter in *Lower Hungary*, and the Hereditary Countries, the Cavalry returning home. Nine Imperial Regiments of Foot, and as many of Horse are to Quarter under the Orders of Lieutenant General *Scheffenberg* and Prince *Louis* of *Baden* along the *Drave*, in *Croatia* and *Sclavonia*; 12 Regiments of Horse and 7 of Foot, with the *Hussars* and *Hussars* lately commanded by the Count *de Pless* and *Tranckostina*; 7 other Regiments of Horse and as many of Foot are to have their Quarters in the Hereditary Countries; and the Count *de Bilibinsky*'s *Hussars* theirs on the Frontiers of the *Lower Austria*. The Electors of *Brandenburg* and *Saxony* have, we are told, promised to recruit their Troops that served in the Imperial Army this Campaign, and to send them back to *Hungary* in the Spring. We have advice that the *Grand Visier* was lately encamped on the other side of the Bridge of *Essek*, and that 6000 Soldiers and *Peasants* were at work on the new Fortifications he had ordered to be made for the security of the said Bridge.

*Vienna*, Octob. 20. We had advice that the *Grand Visier* had caused a Bridge to be laid over the *Danube* between *Blacke* and *Belgrade*, and that his Troops had begun to pass it in order to approach towards *Segedin*, so try to recover that place, which is of very great importance to them, because of the passage of the *Theiss*, it being the last place they are Masters of on that River. The Duke of *Lorraine* continues encamped near *Coleza* to observe them; and for the mean time the Siege is carried on with all the vigour imaginable, and we hope shortly Letters will give a very good account of it. The *Belieged* the Forces of *Croatia* commanded by Lieutenant General *Scherff* &c. and the Prince of *Baden*, are by this time before five Churches. The Letters from *Poland* give an account, that the King had on the 24th Instant obtained a *truce* of six weeks, the *Turks* this Treaty, of whom it is said 20000 were killed upon the piece; we hope to receive by our next the particulars of this great Action.

*Colonia*, Octob. 25. The Elector of *Cologne* has made Count *Ferdinand de Fursberg* his chief Minister of State, who is now with his Electoral Highness at *Bonn*. The Imperial Sub-Commissioners have condemned to perpetual banishment 18 Burgers of this City, formerly Members of the Magistracy, who have for several Months absented themselves, and refused to answer to the Articles of accusation exhibited against them; and their Goods

are ordered to be confiscated. The Letters from *Viana* tell us, that Signior *Cassano*, was arrived there from *Rome* with the Caps for the new Cardinals of *Germany* and *Poland*. That the Forces of *Brandenburg* and *Saxony* were marching home; and that the *Bavarian* Cavalry would do the like; but that the Troops of the *Circles* would winter in *Hungary*.

*Hague*, Nov. 1. Prince Philip of *Brandenburg* has been recalled 4 days at *Amsterdam*, and is expected here the beginning of the next week. The States of *Holland* will recall him on Wednesday next.

*Brussels*, Nov. 1. Our Governor General returned thither on Friday last from *Flanders*, and to Morrow his Excellency intends to go with the Nobility and Generals to *Terturen* to keep the Feast of *St. Hubert*. Some Advices from *Vienna* speak of a great victory obtained the 4th past by the King of *Poland* against the *Turks* and *Tartars*; of whom it is said, 20000 were killed upon the piece, and all their Cannon and Baggage taken, but this good news needs a confirmation.

*Paris*, Nov. 2. The *Abbot Serflent* arrived here the 26th of the last Month from *Rome*, with the Hat for Cardinal *Rampal* the *Pope*'s Nuncio at this Court. The King has given the Regiment of Foot lately commanded by Count *Congratzke*, who was killed this Campaign in the *Moravia*, to the *Sieur de Sourbec* Major of the Regiment of *Swiss* Guards.
