HE Campagne being ended, the General Officers begin to return hi-ther; The Prince of Courland arrived here the 23d Instant, and will part again from hence in few days for Mittau, to visit his Brother the Duke of Courland. The last Advices from Sniatyn gave an account, That the King had not only quitted Jaffy, for that it was not defensible, but had likewise caufed the several Forts, that were built to secure the passages of the great Forest of Bickovina, to be demolished; from whence People conclude, that the Forces of this Crown will not in a long time advance again so far, but that his Majesties design is to employ his Arms the next Campagne against Cuminiec. He has already fent a Detachement of 5000 Horse, with Orders to post themselves in the Neighborhood of that place; And if this number be not fufficient, other Troops will be joined with them to block to the during the approaching Winter. The Ambassadors of Moscowy are still here, and it's not yet known in what place they will have their first Audience. In the mean time Complaint has been made to them by the King's Command, that the Forces of the Czars have not given the Tartars the least diversion this Summer, as they were obliged to do by the new Alliance; For though we have had feverai Reports that the Moschvites and Cossacks subject to them, were marching in very confiderable Bodies to invade the Crim Tareary, yet after all it appears that they have not committed the least Hostility against them; The Reason of which we may well presume to be, that they were designous to fee the Success of this Campagne before they entred into the War, having this Prefence to justifie it, that the League is not yet ratified by the Dyet of this Kingdom

Vienna, Nov. 17. Since our last, we have the Confirmation that the Turks, upon the News of the approach of the Prince of Baden abandoned Darda (a place of confiderable strength, as well by its Scituation as Fortification, which commands the Danube, and on that fide covers the Bridge of Ef-Secke) and retired to the Town of Essecke, leaving only a small Body of Horse to observe the Imperia-lists, but these seeing our Troops advance immetliately fled; The Prince of Baden having possessed himself of Darda, sent Detachements to burn the Bridge of Effecke with several Fireworks, which they executed fo successfully, notwithstanding the Enemy play'd upon them all the time with their Cannon from Esecke, that they quite destroyed the Bridge from Darda to the Drave, as likewise the Bridge of boats which the Turks had over that River; after which the Prince of Baden marched back towards Capofinar to attack that place, if hot already abandoned by the Turks, as the Report fays

it was. By the places the Imperialifts are now Masters of on that side, they will be able not only to hinder the Enemy from repairing the faid Bridge; but li'ewise from sending any Supplies to Sinber, Alba Rezalis, and Canisa. We have an account from Zolnocke, that General Carassa had surnished that place, where he intends to relide this Winter, with Provisions, and whatever else is necessary for the desence of a Frontier Town as that now is; And that' he had fent the Marquis Doria with 3000 Men, Horle and Foot, to Rimasombat near Agria and had commanded the Hungarian Troops to post themselves at Onot, in order to block up Agria this Winter; And that Count Magni was quartered with his Regiment of Dragoons in Ungwar, and Count Strozzi with some Horse and Foot at Berlas, to block up the Fortress of Montgatz, in which, we are informed, there is still a Garilon of 1260 Foot, and 300 Horse. They write from Croatia, That the Militia of that Countrey, who had attended the Prince of Baden in his Expedition to the Bridge of Effecke, were returned home with

great many Prisoners.

Vienna, Nov. 17. On Thursday last their Imperial Majesties went to Closter-Neuburg, to divert themselves with Hunting; And having kept there the next day with great Magnificence the Feast of St. Leopold, returned hither in the Evening. The Prince of Baden did not think fit to leave a Garison in Darda, the Turks having quite ruined the place before they abandoned it.

Ratibonne, Nov. 19. The Advices from Hungary fay, That the Imperial Forces commanded by Prince Louis of Baden arrived the 30th of the lait month near the Bridge of Essecke; That the 1st Instant some Troops were detached, to observe the scituation of the Fortress of Darda; That they found it abandoned, and part of the Bridge; which is 8565 Paces long, and 17 broad, burnt by the Enemy; That the Night following the Imperialists, notwithstanding the Tutks endeavoured to hinder them with their Cannon from the Fortress of Effecke, burnt what remained of the Bridge in fuch manner, that it will be impossible to repair it in a years time, though all the Garisons of the Neighbouring places should be employed in the work. The 3d, the Prince of Baden, marched back towards Caposwar, with above 1266 Prisoners, Men, Women and Children, intending to possess himself of that place, and then to put his Troops into their Winter-quarters.
