have received a Communication from the Right Honourable the Earl of Clarendon, K.G., Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, concerning a despatch addressed to his Lordship by the Comte de Persigny, Ambassador at this Court from His Imperial Majesty the Emperor of the French, to the effect that a certain number of floats, bearing inscriptions to denote the place of their immersion, were thrown overboard during the recent expedition of His Imperial Highness Prince Napoleon to the North Sea, in the French frigate "La Reine Hortense;" with a view to ascertain the direction of the currents in that sea. His Excellency desires that, in the event of any of these floats being cast upon the shores of Great Britain, the same may be transmitted to him, without loss of time, at the French Embassy in London.
