THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Paris, enclosing copy of a French Imperial Decree, prolonging until the 17th October, 1857, the regulations contained in Article 2 of the Decree of the 17th October, 1855, with reference to the nationalisation of foreign ships. A translation of the Decree of the 17th October, 1855, appeared in the London Gazette of the 6th November of that year.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Acting Consul-General at Buenos Ayres, enclosing a copy of a translation of a Decree of the Buenos Ayrean Government (an extract from which is subjoined), respecting the new Pilotage Regulations.

(Copy.)

*Extract from Decree issued by Buenos Ayrean Government, dated July 30, 1855.*

ART. 1.—The profession of branch pilot is declared free, in accordance with the constitution in

all the ports, roads, coasts, and rivers of the State, said profession being open to companies as well as single pilots, without power of interference on the part of the Government in their scale of pilotage, with the only obligation of publishing said scale by officially communicating the same at the office of the Captain of the Port.

ART. 2.—To be a branch pilot the same conditions are requisite as those of a port pilot, under regulation of Art. 7, of Decree January 22, 1854.

The diploma of pilot shall be granted from the Marine Department.

3rd.—No vessel shall be obliged to take a pilot on entering or leaving the port, thereby being exempt from the payment of the half pilotage recoverable in accordance with the Decree dated 8th July, 1830, the captain being now at liberty to take or refuse a pilot on board.

4thly.—Whenever any number of licensed pilots should desire to form a Company, they must notify the same at the Captain of the Port's office, with a statement of the rules and scale of charges to be put in force.

5thly.—Branch pilots in their profession are subject to the maritime laws and regulations of the State, and in case of action at law will be judged by commercial, private, marine, and general naval code.

6th.—Let this be published and communicated and given to the Official Register.

## Chester Waterworks Company.

(Extension and Amendment or Repeal of Act; Increase and Regulation of Capital; Power to Borrow Money; to Sell or Lease their undertaking to the Corporation of Chester; and further powers.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament, in the next session, for an Act to alter, amend, extend, and enlarge the powers, provisions, and regulations, or some of them, of an Act of Parliament passed in the seventh year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act for better supplying the inhabitants of the city of Chester with water," or otherwise to repeal the same, and to reincorporate the Company incorporated by the said Act, under the name and style of "The Chester Waterworks Company," with the same or other and more extensive powers.

And it is intended by the said Act to confer upon the said Company the following, or some of the following, among other powers; that is to say: To construct and maintain all such reservoirs, filtering beds, mains, pipes, and other works, as may be necessary for supplying efficiently with water the inhabitants of the borough and city of Chester, and county of the said city, and also the several parishes, townships, and places following, in the suburbs of the said borough and city, and county of the said city, or some of them, or some parts thereof; that is to say: the parishes of Saint John the Baptist, Saint Mary-on-the-Hill, Saint Oswald, the Holy and Undivided Trinity, Backford, Christleton, Plemondstall, and the several townships or places of Bache, Blacon-cum-Crabwall, Backford, Boughton (otherwise Great Boughton), Chester Castle, Christleton, Claverton, Hoole, Huntington, Littleton, Marlston-cum-Lache, Great Mollington, Little Mollington, Moston, Newton by Chester, Rowton, and Upton, all in the county of Chester; the parish of Hawarden, and the several townships or places of Bretton, Broughton, Sealand, and Saltney, in the county of Flint.

To enable the Company to regulate their capital, to authorise the conversion and consolidation of all or any part of the shares of such Company into a general capital stock, to fix and regulate the scale of voting in respect of such shares or stock, to confirm the existing preference shares of the Company, to raise further capital for the general purposes of the Company, by the creation and issuing of new shares, with or without a preference attached thereto, and also to borrow money by bonds, mortgages, annuities, or otherwise, on the security of all or any part of the property belonging to the Company, or to be hereafter acquired by them, and the rents, rates, assessments, charges and duties, which they are at present authorised to levy, or which they shall be authorised to levy by the said intended Act.

To confirm and make effectual if necessary, the arrangements and agreements made in pursuance of the powers of the said recited Act between the Company, thereby incorporated and the owners or proprietors of the old Chester Waterworks.

To enable the Company to sell their property, rights, privileges and interests to the mayor, aldermen and burgesses of the borough of Chester, by agreement, and to enable the said mayor, aldermen and burgesses to purchase, hold, use and exercise the same, and to raise the necessary funds for purchasing and maintaining the said undertaking by mortgage thereof, and of the rents, rates and profits to arise therefrom, and of the borough rate, or of a rate to be specially authorised by the said intended Act, and of the property of the said corporation or otherwise.

To continue, or to alter, vary, and amend the rates or rents which the Company are at present authorised to levy for their supply of water; and to confer upon the Company such other powers, rights, and privileges as may be necessary or expedient for effectually supplying water within the limits above mentioned, and for carrying out the objects of the said intended Act, as are usual in Acts of the like nature.

And it is also proposed to incorporate with the said intended Act all or some of the provisions of "The Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," and "The Waterworks Clauses Act, 1847."
