Cape Race Light, Newfoundland

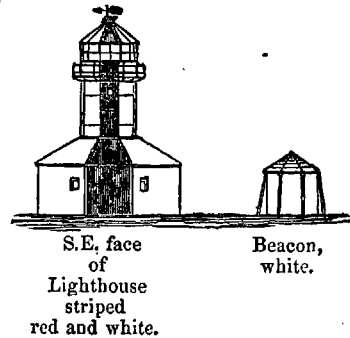
THE Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade give notice, that the Lighthouse recently erected upon Cape Race (Newfoundland)

will be lighted, and will continue to exhibit a *fixed white light*, from sunset to sunrise, on and after the 15th of December, 1856.

The light will be visible to seaward from N.E. by E. round by the S.E. and South to West.

The light is elevated 180 feet above mean water level of the sea, and may be seen in clear weather 17 miles from a

ship's deck. The tower appears as shown herewith, and is striped red and white vertically. It stands close to the old beacon, which has been cut down, as shown in the sketch.



The lighthouse is in lat. $46^{\circ} 39' 12''$ N., long. $53^{\circ} 2' 38''$ W.

[All bearings are magnetic. Var. 24° W.]

Herne Bay Turnpike Road.

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the power and authority of the said Act of the 14th and 15th of Victoria, cap. 38, given to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and in conformity with the said application, I do by this Provisional Order under my hand declare,—subject to the confirmation hereof by Parliament,—that from the twentieth day of July one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, the rate of interest shall be reduced from five pounds to three pounds per centum, per annum, upon the bonded or mortgage debt of two thousand six hundred pounds, charged or secured upon the tolls or revenues of the said road.

Besselsleigh Turnpike Road.

(Continuation of Term; Repeal or Amendment of Acts; Alteration and Reduction of Interest, and Payment of Principal.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament, in the ensuing session, for an Act to continue and extend the term, and to alter, amend, and enlarge some of the powers and provisions of four several Acts of Parliament:—One passed in the 11th year of the reign of His Majesty King George the 3rd, intituled "An Act for amending and widening the road from Besselsleigh, through Wantage, to Hungerford, in the county of Berks; and from Wantage to Marlborough, in the county of Wilts; and from the turnpike-road between Reading and Wallingford, through Halfpenny-lane, to the Old Red House upon Wantage Downs; and from thence to Lamborn, in the said county of Berks:—"

—Another Act, passed in the 12th year of the reign of His said Majesty King George the 3rd, intituled "An Act to explain and amend an Act of the eleventh year of the reign of His present Majesty, 'for amending and widening the road from Besselsleigh, through Wantage, to Hungerford, in the county of Berks; and from Wantage to Marlborough, in the county of Wilts; and from the turnpike-road between Reading and Wallingford, through Halfpenny-lane, to the Old Red House, upon Wantage Downs; and from thence to Lambourn, in the said county of Berks:—'"

(Incorporation of Company; Construction of Works; Power to Sell or Lease.)

And it is intended to apply for powers to borrow money, and levy tolls, rates, and duties, for and in respect of the use of the said pier or landing place, and other works and conveniences, and to confer, vary, or extinguish exemptions from payment of tolls, rates, and duties.

And it is intended to empower the Company, to sell or lease their undertaking to any person or corporation.

And it is intended to incorporate in the said Bill, some or all of the provisions of the following Acts; that is to say: “The Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845,” “The Land Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845,” “The Commissioners Clauses Act, 1847,” and “The Harbours, Docks, and Piers Clauses Act, 1847.”
