PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act, of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, section sixty-eight, and of the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, section twenty-one, and of the Act of the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty, chapter twenty-six, section eight, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council, a scheme, bearing date the thirteenth day of *November*, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, in the words following, that is to say :

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, section sixty-eight, and of the Act of the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, section twenty-one, and of the Act of the fifth and sixth years of your Majesty, chapter twenty-six, section eight, have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme relating to the Bishoprick of Gloucester and Bristol.

"Whereas the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol, is seised in right of his bishoprick of divers manors, lands, tithes, tenements, and hereditaments, the whole or the greater part of which have been demised on leases for lives or years for small annual reserved rents and upon payment of fines, and the said bishop is also in right of his said bishoprick, beneficially interested in or otherwise entitled to certain sums of stock or cash invested or held in trust in the manner mentioned in the said Acts, and particularly described in the Schedule hereunto annexed, marked B.

"And whereas one of the purposes of the said recited Acts is to provide a fund for making better provision for the cure of souls, and the said bishop has agreed with us that the said manors, lands, tithes, tenements, and hereditaments (except as hereinafter excepted), stock and cash, should be dealt with in the manner hereinafter mentioned, and we are of opinion that it would ultimately conduce, as well to the improvement of the said fund as to the permanent benefit of the said bishoprick, to deal with the same accordingly.

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and

propose with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol, testified by his having hereunto affixed his hand and episcopal seal, that in consideration of the money payment hereinafter mentioned to be paid by us to the said bishop and his successors, in the said bishoprick, all the manors, lands, tithes, tenements, and hereditaments which now belong, either in possession or reversion, to the said Charles, Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol, in right of his bishoprick (excepting any right of ecclesiastical patronage, and the palaces or episcopal houses of residence and demesnes respectively, situate in the city of Gloucester, and at Stapleton, in the county of Gloucester, and excepting also the lands, tenements, and hereditaments mentioned and described in the schedule hereunto annexed, marked A), and all the estate and interest therein of the said bishop shall upon and from the day on which any Order of your Majesty in Council, ratifying this scheme, shall be duly published in the London Gazette, and without any other conveyance or assurance in the law become and be transferred to and vested in us and our successors, and that we and they shall thereupon become and be absolutely seised or possessed of the same in fee, and shall be entitled to the rents, profits, and proceeds thereof, as from the sixth day of *June* now last past, and that in consideration of and for such transfer and conveyance there shall, on the first day of *May*, and the first day of *November*, in every year, be paid by us to the said Charles, Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol, and his successors, Bishops of Gloucester and Bristol, the sum of two thousand five hundred pounds, a proportionate part of the first such payment, calculated from the said sixth day of *June*, to the first day of *November* now instant, to be made on the day on which such Order shall be so published as aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose, that none of the moneys or estates to be received or acquired under the provisions of this scheme shall be applicable to the purposes of our common fund (except only so far as it may be necessary to reimburse such fund any advances made under the provisions of this scheme), until or unless by and under the like authority the Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol for the time being, and his successors, shall have been put into possession in fee simple of real estates sufficient to secure to such bishop a clear annual income (after deducting rates, taxes, and other outgoings including costs of management), of five thousand pounds :

"And we further recommend and propose, with the like consent of the said Charles, Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol, that the said sums of stock so described as aforesaid, in the said Schedule marked B., shall, as soon as conveniently may be, after the gazetting of such Order, as aforesaid, be transferred or sold out, and the proceeds thereof paid to our account at the Bank of England, to be applied towards the objects of this scheme, and particularly to investment in the purchase of any interest in the estates herein proposed to be transferred to us or any or either of them, or of any other real estates :

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prejudice or affect the operation of the provisions of the Orders of your Majesty in Council, bearing date respectively the twenty-fifth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, and the eighteenth day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, for regulating the incomes of the several archbishops and bishops of England and Wales, so far as the same relate to the Bishoprick of Gloucester and Bristol :

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

"SCHEDULE A.

"All that messuage or tenement situate in the Little Cloisters, in the city of Gloucester, near the Palace there, in the possession of Thomas Holt, Gentleman, or his under tenants, by virtue of a lease thereof granted to him on the thirtieth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, by the then Lord Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol, for twenty-one years from that date, subject to an annual reserved rent of six shillings and eight pence, and to the covenants contained in the said lease.

"Also all that other messuage or tenement situate in a place called the College-green, in the precincts of the cathedral in the city of Gloucester, in the possession of Thomas de Winton, Esquire, or his under tenants, by virtue of a lease thereof granted to him on the seventeenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, by the then Lord Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol, for twenty-one years from the twenty-fourth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, subject to an annual reserved rent of six pounds, and to the covenants contained in the said lease.

"And also all that garden situate at the east end of the College Church-yard, in the city of Gloucester, containing by measure one rood and fifteen perches, with the appurtenances, in the possession of Thomas Holt, Gentleman, or his under tenants, by virtue of a lease thereof, granted to him on the eighteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-one, by the then Lord Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol, for three lives, then respectively aged eight years, eight years, and six years, subject to an annual reserved rent of one pound and to the covenants contained in the said lease.

"And also a messuage or tenement, with malt-house, buildings, and piece of ground, and a garden and orchard adjoining, containing by estimation half an acre, situate in Saint Mary de Lode, in the city of Gloucester, in the possession of William Cox Buchanan and Charles Buchanan, Gentlemen, or their under tenants, by virtue of a

lease thereof, granted by the then Lord Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol, on the thirtieth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, for three lives, then respectively aged seventy-three years (since dead), forty-two years, and sixteen years, subject to an annual reserved rent of seven shillings and six pence, and to the covenants contained in the said lease.

"SCHEDULE B.

"The sum of four hundred and seventy-one pounds and eighteen shillings, three pounds per centum Reduced Bank Annuities, standing in the name of the Accountant-General of the Court of Chancery, in the matter of the Right Reverend James Henry Monk, Doctor in Divinity, Lord Bishop of Gloucester, to an account entitled 'The account of James Henry Monk, Doctor in Divinity, Lord Bishop of Gloucester.'

"The sum of one thousand three hundred and eighty-five pounds and fifteen shillings, three pounds per centum Bank Annuities, standing in the name of the Accountant-General of the Court of Chancery, *exparte* the South Wales Railway Company, to the account of the Lord Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol.

"The sum of one hundred and ninety-six pounds and nine pence, three pounds per centum Consolidated Bank Annuities, standing in the name of the Accountant-General of the Court of Chancery, *exparte* the South Wales Railway Company, in the matter of the South Wales Railway Acts of one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, and one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, to an account to be entitled 'The account of the Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol.'

"The sum of seventy-three pounds and three pence, three pounds per centum Consolidated Bank Annuities, standing in the name of Henry Richards, of Horfield, in the county of Gloucester, Clerk, as survivor in a joint account with George Rogers, late of the city of Bristol, Gentleman, deceased, and being the proceeds of monies arising from a sale of land effected under the powers of certain Turnpike Acts.

"The sum of twelve thousand two hundred and fifty-three pounds and five shillings, three pounds per centum Consolidated Bank Annuities standing in the names of the Right Honourable Henry Thomas, Earl of Chichester, John George Shaw Lefevre and the Right Honourable Spencer Horatio Walpole, being the proceeds of certain monies paid to them as Church Estates Commissioners for estates sold by the Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol, under the powers of the Acts passed in the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, and seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and sixteen."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the two several Registries of the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, at Gloucester and at Bristol.
