Clifton Railway.

(For making a Railway from the Clifton Collieries to Workington Harbour.)

WHEREAS, in pursuance of the Standing Orders of the Houses of Lords and Commons, notice of the intention to apply to Parliament, in the ensuing session, for leave to bring in a Bill to authorize the above undertaking (under the above short title), was published in the London Gazette of the 28th day of October last, and in the Carlisle Patriot, a newspaper published in the county of Cumberland, on the 25th day of October, and on the 1st and 8th days of November last, and in the Cumberland Packet, another newspaper published in the said county, of the 28th day of October, and on the 4th and 11th days of November last.

And whereas, for reasons then rendering further proceedings unnecessary, the plans, sections, and books of reference, and other documents, have not been deposited within the period, and at the places in the said notice mentioned.

And whereas, it has since become necessary that the said deposits be now made, and the said Bill proceeded with.

Notice is therefore hereby given, that the said

Bill will be brought in, in the next session, as in the said notices mentioned, and that the plans, sections, books of reference, published map, and Gazette notices, relating to the said railway, tramway, and works, will on or before the 15th day of December instant, be deposited as follows, namely:

And on or before the 31st day of December instant, printed copies of the Bill will be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons.
