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Madrid, Novemb. 21.

HE King went this week to the Buen Retiro, where he will ftay till the 5th of the next month. The Count de Milgar, late Governor of Milan, and named by the King to go his Ambaffador Extraordinary to the Pope, was, upon his arrival here Iome days ago, fent Prifoner to the Caftle of Coria, 20 miles from hence; for returning hither without leave; And the Marquis de Cogolludo, Sonof the Duke of Medina Celi, is now defigned for the Embaffy to Rome. The new Pragmatica for the raifing the value of Money occafioning much diforder in Trade, feveral Councils have been held here on this Subject.

Venice, Nov. 23. This day arrived here a Felucca from Dalmatia, by which we have advice, that the Balla of Arcegovina was on his march with 15000 Men towards Clim, and that General Cornaro upon the News of it had drawn what Troops he could together, and joining with the Colfacks, commanded by the Chevalier Janco, had taken his march towards the Enemy, with a refolution to fight them. This week 1000 new raifed Men arrived at the Lido. The Baffa's of Napoli di Romania and Zarnata, have taken two Houles with very fine Gardens belonging to them, where they are now with their Families.

with their Families. Stry, Nov. 9. The King and Queen of Poland have been here feveral days; They intend to go from hence to Lembergh: His Majefty has in the mean time fent thither the Chancellor of Lithaania, to acquaint the Ambaffadors of Moleow, that he wonders very much at their preding with fo much earneftnefs to have the League concluded by his Ambaffadors at Moleow, fworn to by his Majefty, when they have not yet performed any thing of what was flipulated on their fide. The Czars were obliged by this Treaty to employ their Forces this laft Summer againft the Tartarr, to divert them from joining with the Tarks, but, it's faid here, they have been fo far from complying with this Article, that they have not yet committed the leaft Hoffility againft them. The Forces of Lithuania are gone home; And thole of the Crown will, it's believed, have the fame Winter-quarters they had the laft year. The King has refolved to call a Dyet, but they will not meet till the end of January, or beginning of February. The place of their meeting is not yet fixed, this being a matter that muft be first adjufted with the great men of Lithuania, who infilt to have the Dyet meet at Grodno.

with the given meet at Grodno. Warfaw, Nov. 15. The Letters from Lemberg of the 10th Inflant tell us, that the Crown General, and most of the Senators were arrived there, and that their Majefties of Poland were expected if 12th or 13th from Sery. We are told that feveral new Regiments will be raised against the Spring.

Buda, Novemb, 17. We have advice that the Prince and States of Transizvania have fent Deputies to General Caraffa, who commands the Emperor's Forces in Upper Hungary, to agree with him about the Winter-quarters the Imperialists pretend to take in that Country, in lieu of which they offer a confiderable Sum of Money; and to furnith Hay and Oats for 8000 Horfe, giving withall new affu-rances, that they will the next Campagne join their Forces with those of his Imperial Majefty, according to the Measures that shall be concerted by their Deputies at Vienna. The fresheft News we have of the Grand Visier is, That he was retired in great confusion towards Belgrade, not having with him above 10060 Men; And that he had fent feveral Expresses to Constantinople, to represent the posture of affairs on this fide, imputing all the misfortunes of this Campagne, to the ill Conduct of those that have had the management of Affairs before him, who had brought things into that diforder, that it was not in his power to redrefs them. This day arrived here an Officer, who brought the News of the taking of Capoficar by the Impe-rial Forces under the Command of the Prince of Baden. They came before it the 9th, and the place was furrendred the 13th. The Governor being asked, when he marched out with the Garifon, Why he did not hold out longer? Answered, What can the Little Chickens do when the Hen is gone. This place was fortified with a good Wall and Ditch, with a Caftle adjoining to it, and was in a condition to have made a much better Defence.

Vienna , Nov. 24. We have received the following Farticulars of the burning of the Bridge of Ef-ficke: The 1ft Inftant, towards the Evening, the Prince of Baden arrived with the Forces under his Command near Darda; The Garifon, upon our approach, quitted that Fortrefs, after having fet it on Fire in feveral, places. The Prince of Baden caufed his Cavalry to advance towards the Drave, leaving the great Bridge on their Right, the great Moras that reaches from Darda almost to that River being quite dried up, which very much facilitated the execution of our delign. Our Troops skirmished with the Turks who were posted at the head of their Bridge of Boats over the Drave, but it lafted not long, the Enemy retiring to the other fide of the River, and breaking the Bridge to foon as they had paffed it; But they continued the whole Night to fire upon us with Small Shot, and from twelve pieces of Cannon, which how-ever did not hinder us from ruining the other Bridge of about thirty Pares made of great Beams Bridge of about thirty Paces, made of great Beams over a Moras, and failned to the faid Bridge of Boats. The great Bridge from Darda to the Drave, does not go freight to the Bridge of Boats, but on one fide of it, so that having passed the great Bridge you turn to the left, and mult go about 400 paces before you can come to the Bridge of Boats, and
