NAVAL MEDALS FOR THE BALTIC.

Department of the Accountant-General of the Navy, Admiralty, Somerset-House, March 13, 1857.

HER Majesty having been graciously pleased to grant a Medal to the Officers and Men serving on board Her Majesty's ships in the Baltic campaigns, from the 28th of March, 1854, to the close of the Naval Operations in that year, and from the commencement to the close of Naval Operations in the year 1855—

Notice is hereby given, that all claimants to such Medal, notwithstanding any previous application, should apply personally or by letter, with the words "Baltic Medal" on the outside, to the Accountant-General of the Navy, Admiralty, Somerset House.

Every applicant must state his rank or rating, and the name of the ship or ships on board which

he served; also in the case of every Petty Officer, Seaman, or Marine, it is indispensable that his application should be accompanied by a certificate of service, except in the case of his being on board one of Her Majesty's ships, and the application be made through his Commanding Officer, in which case the certificate will not be required.

Where there are several claimants on board the same ship, it is desirable that they should make their applications in one letter through their Commanding Officer, by a list alphabetically arranged under the ships in which they were serving at the time, and affording the information as above required.

No other claims should be mixed up with the applications for the Medal in question, and in all cases where the parties have served in more than one ship in the Baltic between the dates before stated, the name of each ship must be stated.

Gainsborough Union.—Parish of Haxey.

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the parish of Haxey, in the county of Lincoln;—

To the Clerk or Clerks to the Justices of the Petty Sessions held for the division or divisions in which the said parish is situate;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the population of the parish of Haxey, in the county of Lincoln, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons.

And whereas at a meeting of the Vestry, held at the School House, in the said parish, after public notice in that behalf, on Monday the twenty-fourth day of November, last, it was resolved,—

"That the Poor Law Board be requested to issue an order under their seal of office directing that the Act, passed on the 5th August, 1850 (13 and 14 Vict., c. 57), entitled 'An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the Appointment of Vestry Clerks,' shall be applied to, and put in force within this parish, as regards the appointment of Vestry Clerk."

And whereas the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said parish have made their application in writing to the Poor Law Board, pursuant to the above resolution.

Now, therefore, we, the Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, do hereby order and direct as follows, that is to say:—

ARTICLE 1.—That so much of the said Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk, shall forthwith be applied to, and be put in force within, the said parish of Haxey.

ARTICLE 2.—That a salary of seventeen pounds per annum shall be paid to the Vestry Clerk for the time being, appointed under the authority of the Statutes in such behalf and this Order, by the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said parish.

ARTICLE 3.—That the salary of such Vestry Clerk shall be payable up to the day on which he ceases to hold such office, and no longer, and shall be paid by quarterly payments at the several quarters ending at the usual Feast days in the

year, namely, Lady Day, Midsummer Day, Michaelmas Day, and Christmas Day, with a proportionate sum to be paid to his executors or administrators, in case he shall die while holding such office.

And we do hereby prescribe and direct, that the said Vestry Clerk shall perform the following duty, in addition to those set forth in the said Act:—

To revise the valuation book of the said parish, and make copies thereof from time to time when required by the Vestry to do so.

And we do hereby order and direct, that a copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.
