In the "Tariff of Exports" inserted in Article VII of the Convention of Commerce and Navigation concluded on the 9th of December, 1856, between Her Majesty and the Sultan of Morocco, and presented to both Houses of Parliament, by Her Majesty's command, on the 21st of March last, the rate of duty on "all other grain" was stated at half a dollar per *cantar* (a weight).
