THE Marquis de ~~Diella~~ Vice-roy of this Kingdom, has received Orders from the Court of Spain, to appoint Commissioners for the examining the Titles of several Persons, who hold Lands formerly belonging to the Crown. The Ordinance about the new Money is at last published, which will be of great benefit to Trade. This Week parted from hence a Gally for Reggio, with Soldiers, to change that Garrison. The Gallies of the Duke of Turf's Squadron have Orders to winter at Gaeta. Our last Advices from the Levant said, the Venetians had set several Islands of the Archipelago under Contribution.

Genova, Decemb. 5. By a Vessel arrived from the Coast of Barbary, we have the following account of the present Force of Algiers by Sea. The *Marygold*, on Board of which was *Ally Rais Canary*, their Admiral, carrying 48 Guns, and 30 Pedrero's. The *Orange Tree* 46 Guns, and 30 Pedrero's. The *Golden Lyon* 32 Guns. The *Rose*, commanded by young *Canary*, 32 Guns. The *Rose Tree* 32 Guns. The *Seven Stars* 26 Guns. The *Orange Tree* 26 Guns. The *Garden* 26 Guns. The *Plain Sterne* 24 Guns. Besides these, they have 9 or 10 Carvels or small Frigats, from 18 to 6 Guns, with Pedrero's proportionable. They had newly launched a Ship of 40 Guns, another of 30, and a third of 24; And had on the Stocks a Ship that will carry 60 Guns, another of 40, and two of about 30 Guns each. This Week arrived here a Vessel from Spain, with the Baggage of the Marquis de los Balbaes, which will be sent from hence to Milan.

Turin, Decemb. 7. The Marquis de los Balbaes arrived here the 50th of the last month, and the next day parted again for Milan. The last Week dyed the Marquis de Roccaviglione, in the 86th year of his Age.

Vienna, Decemb. 9. We have an Account from Buda; That on the 12th of the last Month, a Party of 150 Horse was sent out towards *Alba Regalis*, to see if they could learn any News concerning the present Condition of that Garrison; That they

were abroad two days without meeting any body that could give them any Information, except a Country Man that was going with Letters from the Bassa of *Alba Regalis* to *Belgrade*, who told them, That the Garrison of *Alba Regalis* consisted not in above 3000 Men fit for Service; That they had not then any Parties abroad; That the Bassa who commanded there, took upon him the Title of Visier of *Hungary*, and that he who formerly commanded that Garrison was Vice-Bassa; That he had caused the Houses that stood near the Town to be demolished, and was making several new Works, especially on the side of the *Buda Gate*, which would add very much to the strength of the place; That Provisions were not very plentiful in the Town; That of Corn they had but a small quantity, and had only Hand-Mills to grind it. The Imperialists having received this Advice, and meeting presently after with a Party of Hungarians of *Vesprin*, they joined with them and advancing to *Alba Regalis*, took 700 head of Cattle from under the Cannon of that place, and returned with this Booty to *Buda*, the Turks giving them no other disturbance, than by Firing upon them with their Cannon, which did them no harm.

Ratisbonne, Decemb. 7. The States of the Empire assembled here, are expecting the Emperor's Answer upon the two Conclusions of the Dyet, concerning the execution of the Treaty of Truce, and the settling the Limits between the Empire and the Crown of France, which were put into the hands of the Imperial Commissioners here, to be transmitted to the Court at Vienna. The matter about the reception of Prince *Waldecke* into the College of Princes is not yet regulated; And, it's probable, nothing will be determined in it till after the Holy-days. We are told from *Municke*, that the Elector of *Bavaria* has given out Commissions for the recruiting his Troops which served in *Hungary* the last Campaign.

Strasburgh, Decemb. 1. Lieutenant General *Monclar* returned hither on Monday last from the new Fort that's building on the Rhine over against *Rastat*, and the next day went to *Haguenaw*. It's said two Regiments of Foot of this Garrison will be sent the next Week to relieve the Troops that now work on the said Fort.
