Naples , November 36. HE Maronis de Ciche, Vice-toy of this Kingdom, has received Orcers from the Court of Spain, to appoint Commiffioners for the examining the Titles of feveral Perfons, who hold Lands formerly belonging to the Crown. Befides these, they have 9 or 10 Carvels or small Frigats, from 18 to 6 Guns, with Pedrero's proportionable. They had newly launched a Ship of 40 Guns, another of 30, and a third of 24; And had on the Stocks a Ship that will carry 60 Guns, another of 40, and two of about 30 Guns This Week arrived here a Veffel each. from Spain, with the Bagg ge of the Marquis de los Balbaoes, which will be fent from hence to Milan.

Turin, Decemb. 7. The Marquis de los Balbaces arrived here the 50th of the last month, and the next day parted again for Milan. The last Week dyed the Marquis de Roccaviglione, in the 86th year of his Age.

Vienna, Decemb. 9. We have an Account from Buda; That on the r2th of the laft Month, a Party of 150 Horfs was fent out towards Alba Regaliz, to fee if they could learn any News concerning the prefent Condition of that Garifon; That they were abroad two days without meeting any body that could give them any Information, except a Country Man that was going with Letters from the Baffa of Alba Regaliz to Belgrade, who told fhem, That the Garifon of Alba Regalis confifted not in above 3000 Men fit for Service; That they had not then any Parties abroad; That the Baffa who commanded there, took upon him the Title of Vifier of Hungary, and that he Who formerly continuanded that Garifon was Vice-Baffa; That he had caufed the Ho fes that flood near the Town to be demolifhed, and was making feveral new Works, effecially on the fide of the Buda Gate, which would add very much to the fitrength of the place; That Provifions were not very plentiful in the Town; That of Corn they had but a finall quantity, and had only Hand-Mills to grind it. The Imperialiffs having received this Advice, and meeting prefetly after with a Party of Hungarians of Vefprin, they joined with them and advancing to Alba Regalis, took 700 head of Cattle from under the Cannon of that place, and geturned with this Booty to Buda, the Turks giving them no other diffurbance, than by Firing upon them with their Cannon, which did them no harm.

Katisbonne, Decemb.7. The States of the Empire affembled here, are expecting the Emperor's Answer upon the two Conclusions of the Dyet, concerning the execution of the Treaty of Truce, and the fetling the Limits between the Empire and the Crown of France, which were put into the hands of the Imperial Commissioners here, to be transmitted to the Court at Vienna. The matter about the reception of Prince Waldecke into the Colledge of Princes is not yet regulated; And, It's probable, nothing will be determined in it 1 till after the Holy-days. We are told from Municke, that the Elector of Bavaria has given out Commillions for the recruiting. his Troops which ferved in Hungary the last Campagne.

Strasburgh, Decemb. 1. Lieutenant General Monclar returned hither on Monday laft from the new Fort that's building on the Rhine over against Rastar, and the next day went to Haguename.
