Buckingham Palace, June 20, 1857.

THIS day the Right Honourable the Lord Mayor, the Aldermen, Recorder, Sheriffs, and Officers, of the city of London, waited upon Her Majesty with the following Address, which was read by Russell Gurney, Esq., the Recorder, and which Her Majesty was graciously pleased to receive upon the Throne.

To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons, of the city of London, in Common Council assembled, humbly approach your Majesty, to offer our heartfelt congratulations, on the safety of your Majesty and the Birth of another Princess.

Feeling at all times the most lively and affectionate interest in any circumstance calculated to enhance the domestic felicity of your Majesty and of your Royal Consort, and thus to increase the happiness of your people, we hail with peculiar satisfaction, this auspicious event.

We fervently pray that your Majesty may be long preserved by Divine Providence, to reign over a free, happy, and contented people, and that the Throne may be secured to your Majesty's descendants to the latest posterity.

To which Address Her Majesty was pleased to return the following most gracious answer :

"Your loyal and dutiful Address has afforded me sincere satisfaction, and I thank you for the deep interest which you have expressed, in the domestic happiness of myself and my beloved Consort.

"The loyal and affectionate attachment of my people, affords me the highest gratification, and you may rely upon my constant endeavours to promote their happiness and welfare."

They were all very graciously received, and had the honour of kissing Her Majesty's hand.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the tenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled "An Act for the more easy recovery of small debts and demands in England," it is among other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that the said Act be put in force in such county or counties as to Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, should seem fit, and to divide the whole or part of any such county (including all counties of cities, and counties of towns, cities, boroughs, towns, ports, and places, liberties and franchises therein contained or thereunto adjoining), into districts, and to order that the County Court should be holden for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act, in each of such districts, and from time to time to alter such districts as to Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, should seem fit; and, from time to time, with the advice aforesaid, to declare by what name and in what towns and places the County Court should be holden in each district :

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, by an Order in Council, of the ninth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, to order that the said Act be put in force in the counties and places therein specified, and the same was put in force accordingly :

And whereas by certain other Acts made and passed in the thirteenth, in the fourteenth, in the sixteenth, and in the twentieth years of the reign of Her Majesty, the provisions of the said recited Act have been amended and extended :

And whereas it hath been represented that it would be to the advantage of the public, if certain alterations were made in some of the districts of the Courts, as specified or set forth in the aforesaid Order :

Her Majesty, having taken the premises into consideration, is thereupon pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven :

The parish of Sandhurst, now in the County Court of Berkshire, holden at Windsor, shall be

in the district of the County Court of Berkshire, holden at Reading ;

The parish of Chearsley, now in the district of the County Court of Buckinghamshire, holden at Aylesbury, shall be in the district of the County Court of Oxfordshire, holden at Thame ;

The townships of Embleton and Wythop, now in the district of the County Court of Cumberland, holden at Keswick, shall be in the district of the County Court of Cumberland, holden at Cockermouth ;

The extra-parochial place of Exmoor; and the parishes of Winsford, Withypoole, and Exford, now in the district of the County Court of Devonshire, holden at Tiverton, shall be in the district of the County Court of Devonshire, holden at Southmolton ;

The parishes of Shudy Camps and Castle Camps, now in the district of the County Court of Essex, holden at Saffron Walden, shall be in the district of the County Court of Suffolk, holden at Haverhill ;

The parish of Chilham, now in the district of the County Court of Kent, holden at Ashford, shall be in the district of the County Court of Kent, holden at Canterbury :

The parishes of Dinas, Newport and Llanychllwydog, now in the district of the County Court of Pembrokehire, holden at Haverfordwest, shall be in the district of the County Court of Cardiganshire, holden at Cardigan ;

The townships of Cheddleton and Basford, now in the district of the County Court of Staffordshire, holden at Cheadle, shall be in the district of the County Court of Staffordshire, holden at Leek ;

The parish of Cannock, now in the district of the County Court of Staffordshire, holden at Wolverhampton, shall be in the district of the County Court of Staffordshire, holden at Walsall ;

The parishes of Witnesham, Tuddenham, Rushmere, and Nacton, now in the district of the County Court of Suffolk, holden at Woodbridge, shall be in the district of the county Court of Suffolk, holden at Ipswich ;

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, sections nine and twenty, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, section three, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fourteenth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, in the words and figures following ; that is to say :

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, sections nine and twenty, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, section three, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the rectory district of Saint Marylebone, in the county of Middlesex, and in the diocese of London.

" Whereas the said rectory district of Saint Marylebone contains a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof ; and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of such rectory district, hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth.

" And whereas arrangements are now in progress for the provision of a church, to be offered for approval by us, and for consecration by the bishop of the diocese, as the church or chapel of the district so hereinafter recommended to be constituted, and so soon as the same shall have become a new parish, according to the provisions of the firstly-mentioned Act, then of the said new parish, and for the use and service of the minister or perpetual curate and of the inhabitants thereof, and a sum of three thousand pounds has been paid over and deposited with us as a guarantee for the completion of the said church.

" And whereas it is intended that one-half part at least of the sittings in the said church or chapel shall be free and unappropriated, and that the remainder of the said sittings shall be let at annual rents, after a rate or scale to be fixed and determined by us, in accordance with the provisions of the herein secondly-mentioned Act, and that the proceeds of the said rents, not otherwise appropriated by law, shall be applied towards the support of, and as and for a stipend for, the minister or perpetual curate of the said district or new parish, and to such other purposes as may be hereafter ordered and declared by us, by an instrument in writing under our common seal, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, pursuant to the provisions of the same Act.

" And whereas the Honourable and Reverend John Thomas Pelham, the present rector of the said rectory of Saint Marylebone, has entered into a bond with us, conditioned on the penalty of five hundred pounds, for the payment to the minister or perpetual curate of the said district or new parish for the time being, so soon as he shall be appointed and licensed, of a stipend after the rate of one hundred pounds per annum, such stipend

or annual sum to be payable until the expiration of a period of six calendar months from the date of the consecration of the church or chapel of the said district or new parish, and no longer, and to be receivable by the said minister or perpetual curate, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year, the first of such half-yearly payments, or a proportionate part thereof, calculated from the date of the licence of the minister or perpetual curate first appointed to such district or new parish, to be payable on the first day of May or the first day of November, as the case may be, which shall happen next after a minister or perpetual curate shall have been licensed to such district or new parish as aforesaid.

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and we are of opinion that there is reason to expect, that from and after the consecration of the church or chapel for the said district or new parish, an adequate maintenance will be provided for the minister or perpetual curate thereof out of the rents of the sittings in the said church or chapel which are intended to be let as aforesaid.

"And whereas the major part in value of the subscribers of not less than fifty pounds towards the cost of the intended church or chapel for the said district or new parish herein recommended to be constituted, have, by an instrument in writing under their hands, signified to us their desire that the right of patronage of the said district or new parish, and of the nomination of the minister or perpetual curate thereto, should be vested in, and be exercised by, the said John Thomas Pelham, rector of the said rectory of Saint Marylebone, during the term of his incumbency of the last-named benefice, and that from and after the next avoidance of such rectory, or in case such avoidance shall occur prior to the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, such right of patronage and of nomination should become and be vested in, and be exercised by, your Majesty, and your successors in right of the Crown.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Archibald Campbell, Bishop of London, testified by his having signed and sealed this scheme, we humbly recommend and propose, that all that part of the said rectory district of Saint Marylebone, described in the Schedule hereunto annexed, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto also annexed, shall be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Thomas, Portman-square.'

"And we further recommend and propose, that the right of patronage of the said district or new parish so recommended to be constituted, and of the nomination of the minister or perpetual curate thereto, shall be assigned to and be vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the aforesaid John Thomas Pelham, so long as he shall continue to hold the said rectory of Saint Marylebone, and that from and after the next avoidance of such rectory, or in case such avoidance shall occur prior to the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, the said right of patronage and of nomination shall become and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, your Majesty, and your successors in right of the Crown.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from

recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

"SCHEDULE.

"THE DISTRICT OF SAINT THOMAS, PORTMAN-SQUARE, being—

"All that part of the rectory district of Saint Marylebone, in the county of Middlesex, and in the diocese of London, lying to the south of an imaginary line, commencing at a point upon the western boundary of the said rectory district, in the middle of Baker-street, and opposite to the middle of Adam-street East, thence extending eastward, along the middle of the last-named street, to the middle of Manchester-street, thence northward along the middle of the last-named street, to a point opposite to the middle of Charles-street, thence eastward along the middle of the last-named street, to the middle of Thayer-street, thence southward along the middle of the last-named street, to a point opposite to the middle of William-street, thence eastward along the middle of the last-named street, and of Bulstrode-street, to the middle of Welbeck-street, thence southward along the middle of the last-named street, to a point opposite to the middle of Queen Anne-street, and thence eastward along the middle of the last-named street, to the eastern boundary of the said rectory district, in the middle of Wimpole-street."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of London.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, section seventy-one, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fourteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, in the words following; that is to say:

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act, of the third and fourth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, section seventy-one, have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for uniting the sinecure rectory of Little Baddow, in the county of Essex, and in the diocese of Rochester, with the vicarage of Little Baddow, in the same county and diocese.

"Whereas the said vicarage of Little Baddow is a benefice with cure of souls, within the meaning of the said Act, and the said sinecure rectory of Little Baddow is a sinecure preferment also within the meaning of the same Act.

" And whereas the said sinecure rectory is at present held, together with the said vicarage, by the Reverend William Brice Ady, and the Right Honourable John James Baron Rayleigh, of Terling-place, in the said county of Essex, is patron as well of such vicarage as of such sinecure rectory.

" And whereas application has been made to us to make arrangements for the union of the said sinecure rectory with the said vicarage, and it appears to us to be expedient that such union should be forthwith effected, and that such other arrangements relating thereto should be made as are hereinafter mentioned :

" Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the said John James Baron Rayleigh, and of the said William Brice Ady, testified by their having respectively signed and sealed this scheme, that the said sinecure rectory and vicarage of Little Baddow shall be forthwith permanently united, and that the same shall become and be one benefice with cure of souls by the name of the rectory of Little Baddow, and that the said William Brice Ady shall thereupon become and be the rector of such rectory, and that he and his successors, rectors thereof, shall be seised of and entitled to all the rights, profits, and emoluments, both of the said sinecure rectory and of the said vicarage in as full and ample a manner as the holder of the said rectory or of the said vicarage now is or ought to be.

" And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Rochester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, sections six and eight, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, in the words following; that is to say :

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, sections six and eight, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for authorizing the sale of certain property formerly belonging to the see of Ripon, and now vested in us.

" And whereas, under the provisions of an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the sixth day of May instant, and duly published in the London Gazette on the nineteenth day of the same month, all the lands, tenements, hereditaments, and endowments, formerly belonging to the said see of Ripon (except certain portions thereof, in such Order particularly described), became vested in us, subject to any legally subsisting leases or grants thereof.

" And whereas application has been made to us for the purchase of all our estate and interest in certain portions of the said lands, tenements, and hereditaments; and after due consideration, it appears to us to be expedient that we should be empowered to dispose of our interest therein, or in any part or parts thereof, in such manner as shall appear to us to be advisable :

" We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that we may be authorized and empowered, by instrument or instruments in writing duly executed according to law, from time to time to sell or dispose of, and duly to convey, according to the provisions of the said Act, all or any of the said lands, tenements, hereditaments, or endowments heretofore belonging to the said see of Ripon, and so vested in us as aforesaid, with their appurtenances, and all our estate, right, title, and interest therein, or in any part or parts thereof, unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same, and his or their heirs, executors, administrators, or assigns, or otherwise as he or they shall direct or appoint, and for such consideration as shall upon due calculation and inquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable.

" And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Ripon.
