respect of his father's being or having been in Holy Orders, or of his father's not possessing or not having possessed more than any fixed yearly income mentioned in any charter, will, deed of composition, or other instrument of foundation or endowment of the said College. And that no person being a British subject shall be ineligible, by reason of the place of his hirth to any Scholarship, Exhibition, or other emolument in the said College.

Now, We, the said Commissioners, by virtue of the powers vested in us by the said Acts, do hereby approve of the said Statutes in the words and form above recited.
