the Imperial Benerals in the New Conqueffs, (with whom may join the *Croats* if there be occafion) will be fufficient to oppole the Enemies defign. The fante Advices fay, That the Grand Visier having left Be'grade provided with all things neceffary for its defence, was parted from thence for *Conflantinople*. They write from *Upper Hungary*, that the *Tarks* have reinforced the Garifons of *Temefivaer*, *Guila*, *Lippa*, and other places on that fide. The *Imperialists* have taken two Women of Quality that endeavoured to escape out of Mongatz; It's not yet known who they are. The great Crois that was planted the rath of *September* laft upon the Steeple of the Cathedral Church of *St. Stephen*, was yelterday towards Evehing, in a great Storm accompanied with Thunder and Lightning, blown down, the Iron Work upon which it flood, being made too flight, yielding to the violence of the Wind.

Vienna, Decemb. 19. On Sunday laft arrived here an Express from Croatia with the News, that the Croats having received advice that 1200 Tanks were on their march to conduct feveral Wagons Jaden with Provisions, Ammunition, Cloaths, and fome Mony to Canifa, they with great diligence marched towards the Enemy, and fell upon them with that Courage and Bravery, that though inferior to them in Number, they killed 500 upon the place, and putting the reft to flight, took the faid Wagons and 180 Prifoners. It is not certain that the Grand Visier is parted from Belgrade for Conframinople, but that he has reinforced the Garifons of Waradin, Temessar, Gyula and Lippa, is confirmed. Count Teckeley was, according to our lait advice, at Temessar

Bruffels, Decemb. 24. The Commissioners of the two Crowns have begun their Conference at *Philippille*, about the Limits on the fide of Namar; And we are told, that the French Intendant has declared, That the King his Mafter will be content with an Equivalent, either in Haynault or Flanders; that fo the City of Namar may not be incommoded by the ftraitness of their Limits; Upon which, the Council of State and War here, hath been feveral times attembled to confider of this Propofal. Yefterday our Governor General went to Icrveuren, to pass the Holy-days there.

Briffels, Decemb. 31. Monfieur Tirimont is come hither from Philipville, to give his Excellency an account of the Progress he has made in his Conference with the Intendant of Mabeuge. The Council of State was thereupon affembled yesterday, where it was refolved to accept the Offer made by the French Commissioner, and to give that Crown an Equivalent, for the Lands they pretend to near Namur, between the Sambre and the Meufe. The Letters from Vienna of the 19th paft tell us, that the Turkifb Troops were moving from Belgrade towards Effecke to supply Sygeth, Alba Regalis, and Canifa, with Provisions and Ammunition. That the Croats had defeated 1200 Turks that were marching with a Convoy to Canifa; 500 of the Enemy being killed, and many Prifoners taken with a confiderable Booty. And that another Body of Croats had made a great Incurfion into Dalmatia.

Hague & Decemb. 27. The Count de Caunitz, Envoy Extraordinary from the Emperor to His Majefty of Great Bratain, arrived here the 21 Inftant from Vienna; And parted again from hence this morning for Flanders, intending, after he has feen the Governor of the Spanish Netherlands, to embark at Oftend for England. The States of Holland are adjourned till the 8th of the next month. The laft Letters from Berlin told us, that the Electoral Prince of Brandenburgh was very ill again. Hague, Decemb. 31. The flate of the War to the next Year has been fent to the feveral Provin ces; It's faid the City of Amfterdam defires to hav fome alteration made in it. The Deputies of the States General had yesterday another Conference with those of the Council of State, to confider (what hath been proposed by the Envoy of Morocc The Imperial Minister here has received the News the defeat of a Turkish Convoy that was going Cani/a.
