PRESENT.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of an Act of the second and third years of Her present Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of an Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the thirteenth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, in the words and figures following; that is to say:

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four, section sixteen; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty, chapter forty-nine, section three; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, section one, have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint John the Baptist, situate at Harlow, in the parish of Harlow, in the county of Essex, and in the diocese of Rochester.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint John the Baptist, situate at Harlow aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Rochester, testified by his having signed and sealed this representation, we humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Harlow described in the Schedule hereunto annexed, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto also annexed, should be assigned to the said church, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint John, Harlow,' and with the like consent of the said George, Bishop of Rochester, testified as aforesaid, we further represent that it appears to us to be expedient, that banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms,

churchings, and burials, should be solemnized or performed at such church, and that the fees to be received in respect thereof should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order with respect thereto, as to your Majesty, in your royal wisdom, shall seem meet."

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing representation has reference

"The District Chapelry of Saint John Harlow, comprises all that part of the parish of Harlow, in the county of Essex, and diocese of Rochester, which is situated on the western and northern sides of an imaginary line commencing at a point marked A, on the map or plan hereunto annexed, in the middle of the turnpike road leading from London to Sawbridgeworth, where such road crosses the northern boundary of the said parish of Harlow, and extending thence in a south-eastern and westernly direction along the middle of the old London road to a point opposite to the middle of a footpath leading from the said road near the parish engine house to Harlow common, and thence extending southward along the middle of such footpath as far as the middle of the occupation road leading from Arkwright's gravel pit to the London road, and thence extending westward along the middle of the said occupation road as far as the middle of the London road aforesaid, and thence westward in a straight line as far as the point marked B on the boundary between the said parish of Harlow and the parish of Latton, in the said county and diocese, such point being situate at a distance of one hundred and eighty yards from the south-western corner of a field numbered 542 on the tithe map of the said parish of Harlow."

Her Majesty having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint John the Baptist, situate in the parish of Harlow, in the county of Essex, to be called "The District Chapelry of Saint John, Harlow," be accordingly made; and that the recommendations of the said Commissioners with reference to the publication of banns
