Hugh Watson	Wounded on the morning of the 27th September, 1857, when in command of the advance guard of the Kamptee Moveable Column, by a party of rebels and mutineers of the 52nd Bengal N.I., lying in ambush in the jungle between the villages of Sing-rumpoor and Kuttengee	Received a slight gunshot wound under the left eye, the cicatrix of which has contracted the lower eyelid, but without injury to sight, and at the same time a contusion of left shoulder, from a fall. He has not recovered the complete use of his arm.
