 Lemberg , Dcemb. 27. Everal Councils having been held here about the Affairs of Malcovy, it was, atter long and warm Debates, refolved to ratifie the League; And that all things might be performed to the fatisfaction of the Ambaffadors, the Form thereof was concerted with them. The 21st Instant the Ambaffadors were entertained with great magnifi-cence. The King and Prince James fat by themfelves at a Table placed under a Canopy of State at the upper end of a great Hall, their Cloaths being covered with Jewels to the value of above a Million of Livres; On the Right hand was a Table for the Ambaffadors, and 60 of the chief Gentlemen of the Embaffy; And on the Left another for the Senators; The reft of the Ambaffadors Domefliques, to the number of about 300, had Tables provided for them in other Rooms; And the Entertainment lasted till midnight. The 22d the King ratified and fwore the League in the prefence of the Ambaffadors, and the Senators and principal Officers of the Crown. The fame day the Ambaffadors had Au-dience of the Queen. Since which time they have had feveral Conferences with the Commiffioners named by the King for that purpose, and have fo far adjusted all matters with them, that they begin to fpeak of their departure. The Chevalier de Cafani is arrived here from Rome with the Caps for Cardinal Pallavicini the Pope's Nuncio at this Court, and Cardinal Radziowski Bishop of Warmia and Vicechancellor of this Kingdom. The 20th of this month an Envoy from the Cham of Tartary came to this place; He has not yet had Audience of the King, but has had a Conference with fome of the Ministers, to whom, it's faid, he represented the great advantages which this Crown may procure by

making at this time a Peace with the Ottoman Port. Vienna, Jan. 12. The States of the Lower Austria affembled here the 9th Instant, the Emperor being feated on his Throne, the Count de Straetman Great Chancellor made a Speech in his Imperial Majeflies Name, representing to them the great Victories and Conquests with which it hath pleafed God to blefs the Imperial Arms, and the farther Progrefs there is reafon to expect from them, with the continuance of the Divine Affiltance, the next Campagne ; And concluding with a demand of Supplies from them, towards the fupporting the walt Expences his Imperial Majelty is at , proportionable to the prefent exigency of Affairs. After which the Emperor fpoke to them hundelf? And then the Count de Mollur, Marelchal of the Province, answered with all fubmillion on the part of the States. We have an account from Upper Hungary, That General Caraffa having adjusted matters with the Deputies of Transilvania, was gone to Esperies, having left the Imperial Forces quartered on the Frontiers of Transitivania, under the Command of

General Veterani. The fame Advices fay, That a Party of Turks of the Garifon of Great Waradin approaching the 26th paft in the night to the For-trefs of St. 7ob, with a defign to have feized at break of day the Cattle that were feeding near that place, the *Imperialists* upon notice of it fal-lied out, and obliged the *Turks* to retire with great precipitation, leaving feven of their Company behind them who were wounded; These reported that Teckeley had been very earnest with the Bassa of Waradin for leave to go to Montgatz, but that the Turks having a Jealousie of him, would not fuffer it. The Letters from Poland give an account that the King had ratified the League with the Moscovites, having the day before given a very magnificent Entertainment to the Czars Ambaffadors, and the chief Nobility of Po'and.

Vienna, Jan. 16. The Funeral Oblequies for the late Empress Dowager have been here folemnized 3 days fucceffively with a great deal of Pomp, at which their Imperial Majefties and the whole Court af-We are told from Upper Hungary, that fifted. General Caraffa is drawing his Troops together for the executing, as is believed, the defign upon Agria ; Towards which place the Ingenier who has undertaken that Service, is gone from Raab with 400 Wagons laden with Bombs and other Necessarie's for that Expedition. The Emperor has fent Orders to his Officers commanding in St rin, to supply the Garifon of Five Churches with Provisions, and what ever elfe they fland in need of.

Br.ffels, Jan. 24. The report of the motion of the Fiench Tro' ps in the New Conqueft had, as we are fince informed, no other ground than that the French were changing fome of their Gatifons; And therefore our Governor General has recalled the Troops that were upon that Alarm fent to Mons, Aeth, and Audenarde. The Letters from Vienna of the 12th Instant assure us, that the defign of Bombarding Agria would be put in execution, fo foon as the Troops that were to be employed in that Service could be drawn together, their march being fomewhat hindered by the difficulties of the Seafon. Our Advices from *Poland* give an account, that the King had ratified and fworn the League between that Crown and the Mefcovites; And that all matters concerning the Operations of the next Campagne had been regulated with the Czars Ambaffadors, who had declared, that their Mafters will employ the next Summer an Army of 200 thousand Men against the Turks and Tartars. These Letters add, that the Cham of Tartary being greatly a-larmed at this Confederacy, had fent an Envoy to the Court of Poland with new and very advanta-geous Propofals of Peace ; but that the King refolving firmly to adhere to the Interests of the Common Caufe, had abfolutely rejected them. Our Governor General continues his refolution of vifiting Namur, but has not yet fixed the time for that Journey.

Bruffels, Jan, 28. A Marriage is concluded between the eldeft Son of the Prince of Naffan Governor of the Spanish Guelderland, and Madamoiselle de Furstemberg, Niece of the Cardinal de Furstemberg, which will be celebrated the beginning of the next month at Cologne, about which time the Cardinal is expected there in his return from the Court of France. They write from Liege, that they are providing there a great Magazine of Corn and other Provisions, And that the Elector of Brandenburgh has written to the Elector of Cologne concerning the new Levy his Electoral Highness is going to make of 3000 Foot and 1000 Horfe. The Letters from Vienna of the 16th Instant fay, that there was no more talk of the Overtures the Turks had made for a Peace, the whole care and application of the Ministers of that Court being to dispose things for a vigorous profecution of the War. Hague, Jan. 24. The States of Holland are

adjourned for a Fortnight, without taking any final Refolution upon the matters they had before them. Before they meet again, the Election will be made of the new Magistrates of Amsterdam, which is utually on the 2d of the next month. The Heer Van Dyckvelt will embark in a day or two for England. The Prince of Saxe Zeits, who ferved the lait Campagne in Hungary, arrived here yesterday, intending to pais two or three months in these Countries.

Paris, Jan. 25. The King returned from Marli on Thuriday laft. His Majelty has named the Seur de la Loubere, and the Sieur Sebret, to go in the Quality of his Envoys Extraordinary to the King of Syam. The Duke de Crequi is very ill, We aro told from Murfeikes, that for the conveniency of the Merchants trading to the Levant, a Barque will part from thence every month for Const antinople.

Paris, January 29. The King intends to come hither to morrow, to give Thanks to God for his Recovery in the Church of Noftre-Dame; After which his Majelly will Dine at the Town-houfe, where he will be ferved by the Officers of this City; There will, befides the Kingss Table, be four others for the Nobility and other Perfons of Quality attending his Majefty; The Shops will be kept fhut the whole day; and in the Evening there will be everywhere Bonfires and other publick Rejoycings. We have an Account by the last Courier from Rome, that the Earl of Caft.emaine Ambaffador Extraordinary from His Majefty of Great Britain, made his publick Entry there the 8th of this month, with great Splendor and Magnificence.

Whitehall , Jan, 22. His Majefty has been Graciously pleased to conflitute by Commission under the Great Seal of England, Sir Ibonus Jeffreys his Agent and Conful General in the Kingdoms of Valencia and Murfia, and the Islands of Majorea, Minorca, Ivica, and Sardinia, in confideration of his Loyalty, and the good Services performed by him.

Whitchall, Jan, 23. On Friday last the Count de Caunitz, Envoy Extraordinary from the Emperor, had Audience of his Majeffy; And this Even-ing he had Audience of the Queen, being conduct-ed in the ufual manner by *Charles Carrell* Efg. Mafler of the Ceremonies,
