Bruffels, Jan, 28. A Marriage is concluded between the eldest Son of the Prince of Nasjan Governor of the Spanish Guelderland, and Madamoiselle de Furstemberg, Niece of the Cardinal de Furst emberg, which will be celebrated the beginning of the next month at Cologne, about which time the Cardinal is expected there in his return from the Court of France. They write from Liege, that they are providing there a great Magazine of Corn and other Provisions, And that the Elector of Brandenburgh has written to the Elector of Cologne concerning the new Levy his Electoral Highness is going to make of 3000 Foot and 1000 Horse. The Letters from Vienna of the 16th Instant say, that there was no more talk of the Overtures the Turks had made for a Peace, the whole care and application of the Ministers of that Court being to dispose things for a vigorous prosecution of the War.

Hazue, Jan. 24. The States of Holland are

adjourned for a Fortnight, without taking any final Resolution upon the matters they had before them. Before they meet again, the Election will be made of the new Magistrates of Amsterdam, which is untially on the 2d of the next month. The Heer Van Dyckvelt will embark in a day or two for England. The Prince of Saxe Zeits, who served the last Campagne in Hungary, arrived here yesterday, intending to pass two or three months in these

Countries.

Paris, Jan. 25. The King returned from Marli on Thursday last. His Majesty has named the Seur de la Loubers, and the Sieur Sebret, to go in the Quality of his Envoys Extraordinary to the King of Syam. The Duke de Crequi is very ill, We are told from Murfeilles, that for the conveniency of the Merchants trading to the Levant, a Barque will part from thence every month for Constantinople.

Paris, January 29. The King intends to come hither tomorrow, to give Thanks to God for his Recovery in the Church of Noftre-Dame; After which his Majetly will Dine at the Town-house, where he will be served by the Officers of this City; There will, besides the Kingss Table, be four others for the Nobility and other Persons of Quality attending his Majesty; The Shops will be kept shut the whole day; and in the Evening there will be everywhere Bonfires and other publick Rejoycings. We have an Account by the last Courier from Rome, that the Earl of Cast. emaine Ambassador Extraordinary from His Majesty of Great Britain, made his publick Entry there the 8th of this month, with great Splendor and Magnificence.
