Allahabad, January 12th, 1858.

I AM directed to acknowledge the receipt of your Letter (Circular 4372) dated 3rd November last, calling for a List of Europeans Killed and Wounded during the recent insurrection by the rebels, and in reply to forward for the information of the Governor-General in Council the annexed Return, which embodies the results supplied by the Returns received from the Commissioner of the Benares Division.

The Lieutenant-Governor regrets the delay which has occurred in furnishing a statement embracing the results for the entire Province, but the attention of those Officers who have failed to supply their returns has again been drawn to the subject, and it is hoped the remaining statements will be furnished at an early period.
