METROPOLITAN CATTLE MARKET.

Alteration of Hours for holding Market for the sale of Horses, Mules, and Asses.

A Common Council holden in the Chamber of the Guildhall of the City of London, on Thursday, the 1st day of April, in the year of our Lord 1858 :

Carden, Mayor.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Market Act, 1857, it was enacted, that it should be lawful for the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London, in Common Council assembled, from time to time, to make bye-laws for (amongst other things) fixing the hours for commencing and closing the market to be holden, under the said Act, and the times at which cattle and horses respectively shall be brought into or exposed for sale in the market and removed therefrom, Be it therefore ordained and ordered, that from and after the 5th day of April, 1858, the market for horses, mules, and asses shall be held as heretofore in the place appointed by the Clerk of the Market for that purpose, within the market place, on Friday in each week, between the hours

of ten o'clock in the forenoon and four o'clock in the afternoon in lieu and instead of between the hours of one o'clock and four o'clock in the afternoon, except on Good Friday, and on Christmas day, when it falls on a Friday, and then the market shall be held on the previous Thursday, between the hours of one o'clock and four o'clock in the afternoon, as heretofore.
