*Venice*, Jan. 14. We had an account by the last Letters from *Dalmatia*, that 500 *Turkish* Horse having made an Incursion into the Territory of *Zara*, the Chevalier *Janco*, who had laid some of his *Morlaques* in Ambush, fell upon them in their return, slew most of them, among which was one of their chief Commanders, and recovered all the Booty they had taken. A Vessel arrived from the *Levant* has brought Letters, which give an account of a great Uproar at *Grand Cairo*, and that the Soldiers in Garrison there had strangled their *Bassa*; The same advices speak likewise of great Commotions in other parts of the *Ottoman* Dominions. The Duke of *Mantua*, and several other Princes are expected here against the *Carnaval*.

*Vienna*, Jan. 20. The Council of War meets almost every day to order the Preparations for the Campaign, which, we are assured, will be begun very early: The Train of Artillery is already preparing, and for the number of Cannon and Mortars, as well as the provision of Bombs, Carcasses, Fireballs, &c. will, it's said, even exceed that of the last year. They write from *Buda*, that in removing the Earth to repair the Fortifications of that place, they had found several great Chests, which were there buried, filled with Money, Plate, and other rich Goods, to a considerable value, which the Director of the *Finances* had seized in the Name of his Imperial Majesty. The Letters from *Five Churches* say the *Turks* continue their design to relieve *Alba Regalis*, *Sigetb* and *Cansfa* (the Garrisons whereof are in great want of Provisions) and that several Troops were moving, as 'twas thought, for that purpose towards *Esseke*. And from *Upper Hungary*

we are told that *Tacke* by was at *Temefwaer* with several thousand *Turks* and *Tatars*, intending to take the opportunity of the Frost to pass the *Thyffe*, and put a Convoy into *Agria*; but that Lieutenant-General *Caraffa* being advertized thereof had given such Orders as was not doubted would frustrate his design. The Garrison of *Montarg* made lately a great incurſion, which cauſed ſome diſorder in one of our Quarters on that ſide; However, the Rebels were forced to retire without any other advantage, than the taking a few Horſes; and were purſued by the *Imperialiſts*, but they could not overtake them. The Prince de *Lubomirski* Great Mareſchal of *Poland* arrived here this week, and will part from hence again in a few days for *Italy*.

*Vienna*, Jan. 23. The Emperor has diſpatched the Serjeant Major-General *de Heyman* to ſeveral Princes of the Empire, to Treat with them about the Troops they are willing to put into his Imperial Majelties Service, which will be employed to recruit the old Imperial Regiments. The King of *Sweden* will aſſiſt the Emperor with a conſiderable Body of Men; and the laſt Letters from *Stockholm*, which were of the 18th paſt, told us that the King had aſſured the Count *de Noſſitz*, the Imperial Miniſter at his Court, that theſe Troops ſhould begin their march towards *Hungary* in the Month of *March*. They write from *Upper Hungary*, that General *Hentſler* upon the advice he had, that eight thouſand *Turks* and *Tatars* were on their march towards *Segedin*, to conduct a Convoy of Proviſions to *Agria*, immediately drew what Troops he could together, and went to meet them; which the *Turks* had no ſooner notice of, but they made all the haſte they could to retire. The ſame Letters tell us, that the exceſſive Cold, and the abundance of Snow that was fallen in *Upper Hungary*, had obliged General *Caraffa* to defer the execution of the ſiege upon *Agria*. The Deputies of *Transylvania* continue their Negotiation at this Court; They ſeem willing to put themſelves under the Emperor's Protection, and to joyn their Forces with thoſe of his Imperial Maſteſty; but inſiſt to have their Country freed from Winter Quarters; In the mean time the Imperial Troops that are lodged there under the command of General *Veterani*, enjoy their Quarters without the leaſt diſturbance, and receive very punctually the Contributions from the States of *Transylvania*, according to the agreement they made with General *Caraffa*.

*Seraſburg*, Jan. 27. Yeſterday arrived here the Marquis de *Villars*, who is going to *Vienna* in the Quality of Envoy Extraordinary from the moſt Chriſtian King, to make his Compliments of Condoſeance at that Court upon the death of the Emperors Dowager. They continue to work with great diligence on the new Fort on the Rhine, over againſt *Rabat*, in which, it's ſaid, 8000 Men are at preſent employed; And that more are expected. There will be ſeveral Encampments the next Summer in *Allace* and on the *Saat*.

*Hamburg*, Jan. 28. The Proceſs againſt the Priſoners, who are accuſed of having been Accomplices with *Jaltram* and *Schuliger*, in the Conſpiracy for which they were lately Executed, is reſum'd, and it's believed, Sentence will be pronounced in a day or two againſt *Grollau*, and *Vander Linden*. The *Sindie Polman*, who was ſome time ſince deputed by the Magiſtrates of this City to the Elector of *Brandenburgh*, having ſaid ſo ſoon as he heard that *Jaltram* was ſeized, has been cited to appear, and upon default will be adjudged Guilty of the Crimes whereof he's accuſed. They write from *Stockholm*, that the King of *Sweden* had given Orders for the fitting out a conſiderable Squadron of Men of War, againſt the Spring. And that the Republick of *Venice* ſollicit'd his Maſteſty to give the Count de *Coningmarke* leave to continue in their Service the next Campaign.

*Coblentz*, Jan. 29. The laſt week arrived here the Marquis de *Boſſiers*, Governor of *Luxembourg*, from *Bonn*; His Buſineſs was, as we are inform'd, to acquaint our Elector with the King his Maſteſty's Recovery, and to aſſure him, that it is his Maſteſty's Intention to preſerve the Truce with the States of the Empire. Having perform'd his Commiſſion at this Court, he went from hence to *Mentz*.

*Bruiſels*, Jan. 30. The Letters from *Vienna* of the 19th Inſtant tell us, That the Prince of *Lubomirski* was arriv'd there from *Poland*, and had been in Conference with the Imperial Miniſters, and would part in few days for *Italy*; The common Report ſaid, it was a Journey of Devotion; But at the ſame time 'twas believed, he had a private Commiſſion from the King of *Poland* to the Princes his Allies, about Matters relating to the preſent War. The ſame Letters ſay, the Emperor is frequently preſent in the Council of War, to haſten the preparations for the next Campaign, which they ſeem reſolv'd to open very early. And that the Prince and States of *Transylvania* do by their Deputies de *Vianſa*, offer to acknowledge the Emperor for their Sovereign Lord, and to ſend a certain number of Troops againſt the Common Enemy, upon Condition they may be exempted from Winter-quarters. They write from *Lower Hungary*, that the *Turks* aſſembled near *Eſſecke*, expecting a great many Wagons with Ammunition and Proviſions from *Belgrade*, which they were to Convoy to *Alba Regalis*, that *Caſtan* being in great want; to prevent which, the Imperial Troops quartered on that ſide, had a watchful eye upon the Enemy.

*Bruiſels*, Febr. 4. The young Prince de *Naffau* was Married this week by Proxy, with *Madamoifelle de Furſtemberg*. They write from *Vienna* of the 23d paſt, that the *Turks* had aſſembled on the other ſide of the *Thyffe*, under pretence of relieving *Agria*, but that their real deſign was to ſurpriſe *Segedin*, of which General *Hentſler* having Notice, he march'd towards them, and oblig'd them to return without attempting any thing. It is ſaid, that the *Turks* in *Agria* are reduced to great extremity, and that it's believed, they will Surrender the place upon the Imperialiſts appearing before it. The Letters from *Madrid* of the 16th paſt tell us, that his Catholick Maſteſty was reſolv'd to proceed in the Reform of the ſeveral Councils.

*Hague*, Febr. 8. The Heer *Van Dyckvelt* being returned from *Amſterdam*, whither he went the laſt week, intends to embark to morrow or next day for *England*. The Differences between this State and thoſe of *Lower Germany* will, it's believed, be accommodated, upon propoſal whereof, Orders have been ſent to the Admiralty of *Rotterdam*, to ſeek off the extraordinary Impoſitions, that have of late been laid upon Goods coming from thoſe parts. They write from *Hamburg*, that they had an account by Letters of the 10th of the laſt month from *Lemberg*, that the *Mofcovite* Ambaſſadors had had their Audience of Leave of the King of *Poland*; And that they would in a few days begin their Journey towards *Vienna*. The Letters from *Vienna* of the 26th paſt tell us, that the Imperialiſts of *Five Churches* had made an other Excursion towards *Sigeth*, and had burnt about 60 Houſes in the Neighborhood of that place, and two Mills, which were of great uſe to the Inhabitants and Garriſon of *Sigeth*.

*Paris*, Febr. 4. The King went on Monday laſt to *Marli*, with intention to ſtay there till Friday. The Marſchal de *Crequi*, who was taken ill on Friday laſt, dyed yeſterday in the afternoon in the 57th year of his Age; And the Duke de *Crequi*, his Brother, lies very ill, with little hopes of his Recovery. The Letters from *Rome* of the 11th of the laſt month tell us, the Ambaſſador of *France* had declared to the Pope, that the King his Maſteſty was willing that the preſent Truce ſhould be charged into a perpetual Peace, that ſo the Chriſtian Arms might have nothing to divert them from the Proſecution of the War againſt the *Turks*; And that his Holineſs had appointed a Congregation of 12 Cardinals to conſider of this Propoſition.

*Whitehall*, Febr. 2. The Lady *Ann Sophia*, youngſt Daughter of their Royal Highneſſes Prince *George* and the Princeſs *Ann* of *Denmark*, dyed this afternoon, having been ill about a Fortnight.
