Venice, Jan. 14. We had an account by the last Letters from Dalmatia, that 500 Thrksh Horse having made an Incussion into the Territory of Zara, the Chevalier Janco, who had laid some of his Morlaques in Ambush, fell upon them in their return, slew most of them, among which was one of their chief Commanders, and recovered all the Booty they had taken. A Vessel arrived from the Levant has brought Letters, which give an account of a great Uproar at Grand Carro, and that the Soldiers in Garison there had strangled their Bassa; The same advices speak likewise of great Commotions in other parts of the Optoman Dominions. The Duke of Mantua, and several other Princes are expected here against the Carnaval.

Vienne, Jan. 20. The Council of War meets almost every day to order the Preparations for the Campagne, which, we are assured, will be begun very early! The Train of Artillery is already preparing, and for the number of Cannon and Mortars, as well as the provision of Bombs, Carcasses, Fireballs, &c., will, it's said, even exceed that of the last year of they write from Buda, that in removing the Easth to repair the Fortiscations of that place, they had found several great Chests, which were there buried, filled with Money, Plate, and other rich Goods, to a considerable value, which the Director of the Finances had seized in the Name of his Imperial Majesty. The Letters from Five Churches say the Turks continue their design to relieve Alba Regalia, Sigeth and Canssa (the Garisons whereof are in great want of Provisions) and that several Troops were moving, as 'twas thought, for that purpose towards Escake. And from Upper Hungary

ive are told that Tacke'ey was at Temeswaer with sean thousand Turks and Tirturs, intending to take the opportunity of the Frost to pass the Theffe, and put a Convoy into Agria but that Lieutenant-General Caraffa being advertised thereofy had given fuch Orders as 'twas not doubted would fruit rate his defign. The Garifon of Mentgatz made lately a great incursion, which caused some disorder in one of our Quarters on that fide; However, the Rebels Were forced to retire without any other advantage, than the taking a few Horses; and were pursued by the Imperialists, but they could not overtake them. The Prince de Lubenirski Great Marefchal of Poland arrived here this week, and will part from herice again in few days for Daly.

Vienna, Jan. 23. The Emperor has dispatched the Serjeant Major-General de Heyman to several Prin-ces of the Empire, to Treat with them about the Troops they are willing to put into his Imperial Majesties Service, which will be employed to recruit the old Imperial Regiments. The King of Sweden will affelt the Emperor with a confiderable Body of Men; and the last Letters from Stockhome, which were of the 18th paff, told us that the King had assured the Count de Nashiez, the Imperial Minister at his Court, that these Troops should begin their march towards Hungar) in the Month of March. They write from Upper Hungary, that General Heufler upon the advice he had, that eight thousand Turks and Taxours wereon their match towards Segedin, to conduct a Convoy of Provisions to Agria, immediately drew what Troops he could together, and went to meet this ; which the Turks had no fooner notice of, but they made all the hafte they could to retire. The same Letters tell us, that the excessive Cold, and the abundance of Snow that was fallen in Upper Hungary, had, obliged General Caraffa to deferthe execution of the glelign upon Agria. The Deputies of Transfugania continue their Negotiation at this Court; They feem willing to put themselves under the Emperor's Protection, and to, joyn their Forces, with those of his Imperial Majesty; but infift to have their Country freed from Wilter Quarters: In the mean time the Imperial Troops that are lodged there under the command of General Vererani, eliby their Quarters without the least diffurbance, and receive very punctually the Contributions from the States of Transylvania, according to the agreement they made with General Caraffa.
