

vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the said Louisa Jane Oakeley, her heirs and assigns for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE

"The District of PENRHYN, being—

"All those parts of the parishes of Llanvihangel y Traethau and Llandecwyn, in the county of Merioneth, and in the diocese of Bangor, lying to the north of the river or estuary called or known as Traeth Bach, and also all that part of the parish of Llanfrothen, in the same county and diocese, lying to the south-west of an imaginary line commencing at a point upon the boundary between the last-named parish and the parish of Llanvihangel y Traethau, in the middle of the high road leading from Llanfrothen to Penrhyn, and thence extending northward along the middle of the said road to a point opposite to the southern boundary of the farm called or known as Ty Mawr, and near a public well; and thence extending in the same direction along the boundary between the aforesaid farm of Ty Mawr and the farms called or known respectively as Ty Fry, Cae Merched, and Hendre Heunyd, to the base of the hill called or known as Hirynys; and thence continuing in the same direction along the north-eastern side of the last-named hill, at its base to the water of Traeth Mawr, near to Ynysceiliog."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, been delivered or transmitted to the incumbents and to the patrons of the said parishes of Llanvihangel y Traethau, Llandecwyn, and Llanfrothen respectively, and no objection has been made thereto.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law, immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Bangor.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four, section sixteen; of an Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine, section three; and of an Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, section one; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council, a representation, bearing date the twenty-second day of April, in the year one

thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, in the words following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four, section sixteen; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty, chapter forty-nine, section three; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, section one; have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church called Christ Church, situate at Smannel, in the parish of Andover-with-Foxcott, in the county of Southampton, and in the diocese of Winchester.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church called Christ Church, situate at Smannel aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Richard, Bishop of Winchester, testified by his having signed and sealed this representation, we humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those parts of the said parish of Andover-with-Foxcott, described in the Schedule hereunto annexed, all which parts, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto also annexed, should be assigned to the said church, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Christ Church, Smannel-with-Hatherden.'

"And with the like consent of the said Charles Richard, Bishop of Winchester, testified as aforesaid, we further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at such church, and that the fees to be received in respect thereof should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: provided always, that the said fees to be so received as aforesaid, shall be reserved for and paid over to the Reverend Charles Henry Ridding, incumbent of the said parish of Andover-with-Foxcott, during such time as the said Charles Henry Ridding shall remain such incumbent.

"We therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal wisdom shall seem meet."

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"All those parts of the parish of Andover-with-Foxcott, in the county of Southampton, and in the diocese of Winchester, which are comprised within the boundaries of the hamlets of Swanhill, otherwise Smannel, Enham Kings, Little London, Woodhouse, Wildhern, and Hatherden."

Her Majesty having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church called Christ Church, situate at Smannel, in the parish of Andover-with-Foxcott, in the county of Southampton, to be called "The District Chapelry of Christ Church, Smannel-with-Hatherden," be accordingly made, and that the recommendations of the said Com-
