Madrid , Jan. 30.

HE Count de Humanez, President of the Council de la Hazienda, dyed here yesterday, having been fick three or four days. We have an account of the death of Don Antonio Pan y Agua, Governor General of Oran, and the Coafts of Africa. The Marquis de Villa Mayna, Master of the Horfe to the Queen, is likewife dead. The Count de Melgar, late Governor of Milan, has obtained his Liberty, but has not yet Leave to come to Court. We had an account by an Express which arrived here the last week from Flanders, that the matter of the Limits on the fide of Namur had been adjusted by the Commissioners of the Two Crowns in their Conference at Philipville. The Marquis de Valera has caufed the Body of his Brother the Duke de Vejar, who was killed in the Siege of Buda, to be brought hither, in order to be buried among his Anceftors. The Count de Villar Mayor, Ambaffador Extraordinary from the King of Portugal to the Elector Palatin, has been obliged to make fome flay at Victoria, by reafon of the abundance of Snow that has fallen in /thofe Quarters.

Genoud, Jan. 28. The laft week failed from hence the Count de Sturum with the Ships under his Command for Leghorne, from whence, it's faid he has Orders to return to Holland. We understand, by the Vessels that come from the Levant, that the Turks make their utmost Efforts to have a numerous Army in Hungary the next Summer. Turin, Febr. 2. The Duke of Savoy parted from

Turin, Febr. 2. The Duke of Savoy parted from hence the 20th of the laft month for Venice, being attended by the Counts de la Rouere, de la Trinicé, and de Prela, and the Marquis de Beuil, with feveral other Officers of his House. The Marquis d'Arfy Ambassador of France, is likewise gone to Venice.

Milan, Febr. 4. The 31ft paft, the Duke of Savoy arrived here Incognito, accompanied only with fix or feven Perfons; He went directly to the Houfe of Count Porro his Refident, and having feen what was most curious in this City, his R. H. parted from hence yesterday for Venice, to pais the reft of the Carnaval there.

Venice, Febr. 1. The Elector of Bavaria, the Duke of Mantua, and feveral other Princes are come hither to fee the Divertilements of the Carnaval; And though the first is Incognito, the Doge has not omitted to appoint four Noble Venetians to accompany his Electoral Highness during his stay in this City. The Prince of Lubomirski who arrived here the laft week , had, the 28th paft, Audience of the Doge; He will part from hence in few days for Rome. The Marquis de Corbons is arrived from the Levant, to raife Recruits for his Regiment of Dragoons now in the Morea. The Prince of Bareit of the Houfe of Brandenburgh, has made a Treaty with the Republick for 2000 Men, which he has undertaken to raife against the next Campagne. Prince John of Waldecke has likewife made an Agreement with the Senate for 1000 Foot The laft Ships that arrived here from the Morea, had on Board 53 pieces of brass Cannon taken from the Turks, which are to be new caft. Captain General Morofini continued, according to our freshest Advices from those Parts, at Napoli di Romania; And the Se-rasquier of the Morea at Corinthe. The Bassa of Napo'i di Romania and his Brother are ftill here.

Leghorne, Febr. 3. This week arrived here a Merchant Ship from Smirna, by which we have advice, that the Grand Signior had received an account by the Expresses dispatched by the Grand Visier from Belgrade, that the Overtures he had made in order to a Peace, had been rejected by the Imperialifts, who even refused to grant a Passport for the Amballador he had propoled to fend to Vienna; That this News had very much difturbed him, and made him refolve to remove to Adrianople, fearing it would occasion fome new diforder at Constantinople, where the People were kept in their Duty, by nothing more than the hopes they had of a Peace; And that to fatisfie them the Grand Signior had again declared, that he will command in Perfon his Army in Hungary the next Campagne. By another Veffel arrived from Alexandria, we are informed that they left in that Port four great Ships ready to fail for Constantinople, on which were embarked the new Levies that had been made in those Parts, and some Ammunition and Provisions,

Lemberg; Jan. 18. The Ambaffadors of Mafcovy had the 13th Inflant their Audience of Leave of the King and Queen, to which they were conducted ducted with the fame Ceremonies that were obferved at their fiff Publick Audience; and they are now preparing for their departure, being extremely fatisfied with the Honouis they have received at this Court. In the last Conference that was held with the'e Ambaffadors, it was among other things agreed, that in cafe the Cham of Tartary does the next Campagne join any confiderable number of his Troops with those of the Grand Signior, the Czars of Mojć vy will likewife join a good Body of their Troops with the Forces of this Črown ; And that during the whole course of this War, the Forces on both fides shall act according to such meafores as fhall be concerted between the Allies, for the greatest advantage of the common Interests. The Ling eior's Minister at this Court has been feveral times prefent in the Council of War, which meets almost every day to direct the Preparations for the next Campagne, as well as to confult about the defigns of it. His Majefty has refolved to fend the Bilhop of Primilia with the Character of his Ambaffador to Vienna; And has named feveral other Perfons to go in the Quality of his Envoys to divers Courts of Christendom, to demand affiltance against the Tarks. The Envoy from the Cham of Tarts y has been difpatched with an Answer, that thews the firm Refolution of this Court not to leparate from its Allies. The 11th Inftant, was performed the Ceremony of giving the Cap to Cardinal Pallavicini the Pope's Nuncio at this Court, which had been brought from Rome by the Marquis Cifani : But the King was not prefent at the Solemnity. The Court will'remove the next week to Zolkiew.

Warfau, Jan 29 The Moscovite, Ambassadors having adjusted all matters with the Ministers of this Crown, parted from Lemberg the 21 ft of this month, having fent their Secretary before to Vienna, to prepare things against their arrival there; It was faid, that having finished their Commission at the Emperor's Court, they would go from thence to Venice, but now we are told otherwife, and that they will negotiate the matters they are charged with in relation to that Republick, with the Venetian Ambaffador at Vienna. The King of Poland has named the Sieur Grinsky Palatin of Braclan, to go his Envoy to the Elector of Brand uburg, to demand Succors against the Tarks, and is likewife fending to other Courts for the fame purpole. His Majelty has declared that he will command his Forces in Perfon the next Campagne, and that he will be in the Field before the end of May; He has given out feveral Commissions for new Levies as well of Horfe 36 Foot, and great care is taken to provide Magazines in all the Frontier places for the fubfiftence of the Army.

Cologne, Febr. 11. The laft advices from Hungary tell us, That Count Teckeley, who continued at Temefavaer, had received 30 thousand Crowns from the Grand Visier, and that with the help of this Money, he had railed some Hungarian Troops, part of which he had fent to reinforce the Garifon of Mongatz. That they had an account by Letters of the 10th of December from Constantinople, That the Plague continued to rage there very violently; That the fcarcity of Provisions encreased daily; And that all things were there in great diforder; That Preparations were making for the Grand Signior's removal to Adrianople, from whence, 'twas given out, he would go in the month of April to Bely r.ide, to put himfelf at the head of his Army. That the Cham of Tartary had by his

Envoys, made very preffing Inftances at the Port to be paid the Subfidies that had been promifed him, declaring he should not otherwise be able to fend the Succors to the Ottoman Army, that might be expected from him; But that however, there had been only fent him 50 thouland Piastres, the reft being made up in Jewels, Sables fet with pretious Stones, and rich Furniture for Horfes, which had been taken out of the Grand Signior's Treafury. And that fome Money and Prefents had been likewife fent to the chief of the Militia, and the Divans of Barbary, to engage them to fend their Ships to the Levant to join the Ottoman Fleet the next Summer.

Hamburgh, Febr. 11. Yesterday Sentence was pronounced against the prisoner Vandr Lind, by which he is Condemned to pay 2000 Crowns, and to be a prifoner four years. The Letters from Poland, tell us, That the Mofcovite Ambaffadors were on their Journey to Vienna. That great preparations are making in that Kingdom for the next Campagne. And that Cardinal Pallavicini the Pope's Nuncio, had promifed to provide Magazines of Provisions for

the subfissence of the Forces. Paris, Febr. 22. The Marquis de Bernay, Envoy Extraordinary from the Duke of Savoy to compliment the King upon his Recovery, had the Yefterday 19th Initant his Audiences of Leave. the Cardinal Ranuzzi, the Pope's Nuncio, had a private Audience of his M. C. Majefty. The Duke de Gefvres has taken possettion of his Government of this City. There has lately hapned a Fire at Rochelle, which, befides the other mifchief it did, burnt down the chief Church of that City. We had two days ago an account of the death of the Archbishop of Tours.

Whitehall, Febr. 15. This day the Parliament met at Westminster, and was farther Prorogued to the 28th of April next.
