THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Cagliari, stating that the following Quarantine Regulations will be enforced on vessels arriving in the Sardinian States from the coasts of the regencies of Tripoli and Tunis, from Malta, Algeria, Morocco, Candia, Salonica, and the Syrian Coasts of the Ottoman Empire.

1. All vessels arriving from the territory of the regency of Tripoli, on the coast of Barbary, whatever may be the nature of the bill of health which accompanies them, are to be subjected to fifteen days' quarantine, to commence from the discharge of the susceptible goods they have on board into a Lazaretto of the Sardinian States, where they are to be disinfected and purified.
