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Venice, Febr. 8.

HIS City is filled with Princes, and other perfons of the chiefeft rank, that are come hither to partake of the diwortifements of the Carnaval. In our former we gave you an account of the arrival of the Elector of Bavari, the Duke of Mantua, the Prince of Bareit of the House of Brandenbog, the Prince of Savoy Soilfons, Sc. To which we must now add, that the Duke of Savey arrived here the 6th initant Incognito under the Name of the Count de Tereda, accompanied with five or fix per-fons of quality. We have advice by a Vessel arrived here in 21 days from Nipoli di Romania, that the Seraskier of the Morea, having left a finall body of Men for the guard of the Isformus of Corineth, or the neck of Land that leparates the Golf of Lepanto from that of Engia, was marched with the reft of his Troops towards Patras to reinforce the Garifons of that place and of Lepanco : And that the new Fortifications that are making at Napoli di Romania and on the Hill Palamida are almost brought to perfection.

Genova, Febr.8. This week arrived here the Sman from England, and a Dutch Convoy from Holland and Spain, and another from Smirna bound home.

Lemburgh, January 25. The Melcovite Ambaf-ladors parted from hence the 22d Initant, accom-panied by the Commillioners appointed by the King to conduct them to the Frontiers of Silefia, where they will be received by the Imperial Officers, who have been there fome time expecting them. We are affored, that the Expence which this Court has been at in defraying these Ambaffadors, during their flay here, amounts to above 200000 Florins. Since their departure, the Council of War has been feveral times affembled in the King's prefence, to confult of the means to profecute the War with all the advantage, which we may promife our felves from the ill pofture the Affairs of the Infidels are in, And we have no reason to doubt, it the Moscov. tes perform what they have promiled, but that the Forces of this Crown will make confiderable Progrefics the next Campagne. The Levies that are making in this Kingdom, advance in the mean time with good fucces; And the other Preparations are carried on with the fame diligence; The Popes Nun-cio has undertaken to provide Magazines of Pro-visions for the Army; And the King has declared, that be will be in the Field as early as the Imperia-His Majefty has fent Circular Letters to all lifts. the Palatinates, to acquaint them with the Reafons that have obliged him to put off the meeting of the Dyet till the next years The Turks having provi-ded a great Convoy of Provisions in Maldavia; a Body of Tattars was ordered to conduct it to Ca-

m niec, but in their march between that place and *Choczin*, they were met by the *Coffacks* commanded by General *Mobila*, who defeated the Enemy, and took 200 Wagons Laden with Provisions. Some other Convoys have had the good Fortune to get into *Caminiec*, but the Relief the Gazifon received by them; was fo inconfiderable, that we are affured they do however want many things neceffary fors their Subliftcace, and that they itood in great need of this laft Convoy.

Vienna, Febr. 6, The Preparations for the Campagne are carried on with extraordinary Application; And we are affured, that the Emperor will have 60000 Men of his own Troops in the Field the next Summer, without reckoning the Hungarians; Bavarians, and other Auxiliary Forces. They write from Upper Hungary, that a Party of Turks and Tartars commanded by Teckeley, had made an Incurfion towards Segedin, and burnt (everal Villages, for that the Inhabitants had furnished that Garifon with Provisions; But that the Enemy in their return, were met and idefeated by a Party of *Imperialists*, *Teckeley* being himfelf wounded. The Rebels of *Mongatz* have made ano-ther Sally, but were repulsed with the loss of 50 of their Company kill'd, and 6 taken Prifoners. The Letters from Buda of the 27 past tell us, that the Regiment of Lodron with a Party of Huffars comman-ded by the Count de Ricardi, marched from thence two days before towards Alba Regalis, to keep that Garilon from giving any difturbance to the Convoy that was going from Stiria to Five Charches. The advices from the Ottoman Territories fay, that the Grand Visier was gone to Adrianople, to be prefent at a great Council of War that was to be held there in the Grand Signior's prefence; And that the Turks were drawing all the Force they could towards Hungary, where, as they give out, they will have a very numerous Army the next Campagne. The Letter which the Grand Visier writ fome time ago to Prince Herman of Baden, Prelident of the Council of War, was to this effect: That the Breach of the Peace between the two Empires, had been occafioned by those who had then the Conduct of Affairs; And that they had been punished; That to put an End to the Calamities of the War, he came to Belgrade the last Summer to Negotiate a Peace; But that he then understood, that the Imperial Army was before Buda. That he now writ to him (the Prince of Baden) to know whether they were here in a Disposition to treat, that he might give an ac-count thereof to the Grand Signior, and that a place might be cholen for the Negotiation, prote-Ring, That if the Imperial Court rejected fo reafohable a Proposition, they would be answerable for all the effusion of Blood, and the ruine of the Peo-ple that flouid follow. The Prince of Baden anfwered,
