HE Grand Signior, who during the Contuition and Diforder, with sphich the News of the taking of Buda, and the other unfortunate Succeffes of the laft Campagne, had fulled this Court sind City, found himfelf in fome danger, by the mu-timous caballing of the Leading Caddees and chief Outgrack lanifories ( who are those that hence Su Outerack Janifaries (who are those that being Su-performed iome confiderable Service in the Wars, receive a Dead pay, with liberty to follow their pri-vate 'Vocations') having by the deposing of the Mufei, the Reform he made in the Seraglio, and by declaring he would go in Perion the next Summer against the Germans, quieted the discontents of the People for that time ( of which you had formerly an Account ) He foon after acquainted the Caimacan with his Refolution of going from hence to take his usual Recreation of Hunting, which he was adwied by his Philitians, was very necessary for his Health. The Caimacan and his chief Councillor, most earnestly befought him not to abandon his Imperial City in this critical Conjuncture, and reprefented the dangers to which he might thereby expole his Perfon and Empire, but not being to be prevailed with to cofinne himself to this City (to which he has ever difcovered a more than ordinary Averlion ) he commanded his Horfes, Dogs, and Hawkes, to be got together again; and put in readiness for his Service; And this day began his Hunting, in which, it's believed, he will fpepd most of the Winter, The Grand Vifier Azem who designed to come hi-ther, to affilt at the Councils for the directing the Preparations of the War, having Notice of the Grand Signior's Intentions, has changed his Refolution, and it's faid, intends now to winter at Belgrade; on protence of being the earlier in the Field the next Campagne; But his great and invincible difficulty will be to get Men, Money and Provisions, to put him in a capacity for Action He has, to fave Charges, difmilt many of his Soldiers, that they may reftel h themfelves at their own homes; And has difficulty the Seralquier of Hungary, and advanced the Aga of the fanifaries to that Command; which therve he begins to court the Jamifaries, either out of fear, or foine deep defign. Cuogle, the Grand Signior's Son-In-Law, and Favourite, died the other day-off an Apoplexy as the Caffles on the Dardangli, and was there privately buried, to fave Expence; And not without reason, for never was there luch an empty Treasury in Turkie fince their Empire first began, as at this day. Carattaffan, the late Camai-, can of this place, falling in difgrace with the Grand Vifer, was, for his Mortification, fent the last Summer to the Morea, where he died of Grief; And though the had passed through most of the great and gainful Offices of the Empire, he left only teven

The Pope has, it's faid, refolved to maintain 1000 Men at his own charge in Dalmatia, for the Affiltance of the Venctians agains the Turks. By a Veffel arrived from Candia we have advice, that the Greeks of that Kingdom called Sfaciatres, had revolted, and charged 600 Turks, who were fent to raife the Contributions, killing many of them, and taking feveral Prifoners; and that they had fent four Deputies to Captain-General Morofini to demand the protection of this Republick. They write from Dahmatsa, that Mehemet Bacha, who ferved the laft Campagne in Hungary, was come to Caitaro, with a refolution to embrace the Chriftian Religion.

brace the Chriftian Religion. Madrid, Febr. 13. The King has made the Marquis de los Voles Surintendant General of the Finances; And the Office of Prefident of the Council de Ja Hazienda or the Finances, vacant by the death of the Count de Humanez, is given to Dom Pedro d'Oreyria, which he is to exercise with the Title of Governor under the Orders of the Surintendant; And the Government of Oran, void by the death of Dom Francifco Pan y Agua, is given to the Bailly de Bracamonie, Knight of Maira. The King has ordered the Reform, which was refolved on above a year ago, of the many supernumerary Officers of the several Councils and Tribunals, to be put in execution. Those that bought their Offices, are to receive Interest for the money they gave for them latter the Rate of Five per Cent. till their Principal can be repaid; But those upon whom these Offices were bestowed for their Services are to couting the Joynemis of the fame advantage, The Marquis de Noveles was married the 2d Inflant with Dona Habella Faxarda, Daughter of the Coung d'Ayala. The Sieur Basser, Envoy Extraordinary, from the States-General, made the 7th Instant his Rublick Entry.

Men belonging to St. Malo and Rouen. Vienna, Febr. 19. The 7th Inftant arrived here an Express difpatched by General Caraffa, with the Ratification of the Treaty-concluded with the Prince and States of Transilvania, about the Winter-quarters, and to give the Emperor an account, that he had received part of the Moneys promifed by the faid Treaty, which he intended to employ in remounting the Cavalry and other neceffary Expences. The News we had of the defeat of the Turks and Rebeis under the Orders of Teckeley, by a Party of the Garilon of Segedia, is confirmed, with this farther particular, That Teckelsy was in great danger of being taken Prifoner, the Shot he recei-ved in his Knee havingt made him fall from his Horle. But at the fame time, we are informed, that a confiderable Body of Turks; Tartars, and Hungarians is drawing together near Temilivacr, which is to be commanded by Teckeley for the Relief of Agria; And that a Detachement of these Troops have already pillaged and burnt Arach, Naglock, Halos, and fome other places, from whence the Garifon of Segedin was fupplyed with Provisions. The defign of bomberding Agria will, it's faid, be executed towards the end of this month, for which, a very fine Train of Artillery with Bombs and Carcaffes is preparing at Cafchaw. The lait Advices from the Turkifb Territories laid, that the Grand Vilier was still at Belgrade, but that he had Orders to repair to Adrianople, to attend the Grand Signior upon his Arrival there : And that this Minister judging the Turks would not be able to make Head against the Christian Army the next Campagne, defigns to post himfelf advantageoully on the other lide of the Theyffe, and on the Frontiers of Transitionatia, to keep the Transitomians in their ancient Engagements with the Port, and to draw the Imperialists into Opper Hunsary, where he thinks they will fuffer very much, for want of the conveniency of being fupplied with Prowitions by the Danube. We are told from Poland, That the Bishop of Primislia is coming hither, in the Quality of Ambaffador Extraordinary from that Crown, to concert with the Ministers of this Court the Operations of the next Campagne.

Calogne, Febr. 21. The States of Juliers who were affembled at Dufeldorp, are feparated, after having granted their Duke a confiderable Supply. The laft Letters from Vienna give an account, That the Imperialifts had defeated a Body of Turks who were fent from Sigerb and Canifa, to attack the Convoy that was going from Stiria to Five Churches, and that 200 of the Enemy had been killed upon the place.

Hamburgh, Febr. 21. They write from Postdam, That the 16th Inftant, being the Elector of Brandenburgh's Birth-day, when He entered <sup>3</sup>iato she 68th year of his Age, had been observed there with great Solemnity. The Letters from Poland tell us, That the Mofcovite Amballadors arrived the 2d Instant at Cracon, in their Journey' towards Firma : That the King of Poland had refolved to employ part of his Forces the next Summer on the fide of Himgary, and to leave the reft to join with a Body of Moscovites, to cover the Ukrain, and block up Caminiec, while the other Forces of the Cqurs and the Ceffacks made a Diversion in the Crim Tartary : And that the Coffacks who inhabite near the Black Sea, were preparing a great nume ber of Veffels, in order to make their Incursions

On which Subject the Cardinal Nuncio had the laft week a private Audience of the King at Verfailles. But this Court feens refolved not to quit this Point of the Franchife. We have advice that the Cardinal de Bouillon is very dangeroufly ill.
