Venice, Febr. 14.

HE Carnaval ended laft Tuciday with great Applaufe and Satisfaction of all the Princes that were here, who were the two laft days of it, very Morofini, and the Prince of B reit of the House of Brandenburgh: The Elector of Bavaria and the Duke of Manzua, intend to part from hence on Thursday next for Rome; Whither the Prince de Lubomirski, Great Mareschal of Poland; began his Journey yesterday. On Saturday last 13 great Veffels fet Sail for the Morea, having on board 400 new railed Soldiers, and a great quantity of Provifions and Ammunition. On Monday arrived here from Napoli di Romania, Signior Delfino, Proveditor of the Army, who gives an account, That the new Fortifications that are making on the Hill Palamida, are very much advanced; And that the Captain-General continues with an extraordinary Application, to dispose things for the orainary Application, to dispose things for the Campagne. There are other advices which fay, That Signior Venier was gone to Cruife with 5 Men of War in the Archipelago; And that the Tur-kifh Gallies were returned to Constantinople in a very ill Condition. They write from Cattaro, That some Brigantins fitted out by the Proveditor Extraordinary of that place, had burnt two Turkish Gallics within Musket-fbot of the Fortrels of Caltle-2000.

Genoua, Febr. 15. This week failed from hence two Dutch Convoys, one for Leghorne and Smirna, and the other for the Coaft of Spain. The Cafar is arrived here from Leghorne.

The Letters from Lemberg of the 25th Inftant tell us, That the King and Queen of Poland were gone to Zolkiew, from whence, they intended to return in few days to Lemberg; And that it was believed, their Majefties would afterward take a Journy towards Pruffia. The Sieur Brande, Lieutenant-Colonel of the King's Horte-Guards, is come hither to raile Recruits for that Regiment. Several Officers of Foot are likewife railing Recruits in these Parts. The advices from Molecowy affure us, That great Preparations are making on that fide for the Profection of the War, in purfuance of the League concluded between the Czars and the Crown of Poland.

between the Czars and the Crown of Poland. Cracow, Febr. 9. The Molecovite Ambaliadors arrived here the 3d Inftant with a Train of 300 Perfons, the Troops that are quartered here being drawn out to receive them; They were lodged in the Caftle, and this day continued their Journey towards Vienna. We have advice that another Envoy is arrived at Lemberz from the Chant of Tartary with farther Propolals of Peace, but it's not southed he will be fent back with the fame Anfwer that was given to the former; which was that this Crown will not treat of a Peace, but with the participation and inclution of its Allies.

Vienna, Febr. 16. Major General Thingen, Go-vernor of Five Churches, has lent hither a particular account of the Rencounter which Colonel Macuri had lately with a Party of 300 Turkif Horfe near Sigeth, who were not fent out to attack the great Convoy that was going from Stiria to Five Churches, as 'twas at first reported, but served for a Guard to a Turkish Aga that was feat from Essenter to Sigeth with 15000 Florins for the payment of that Garilon. The Particulars of this Action are as follow : Major General Thingen having the 30th of the laft Month received Advice that a Party of Turks had paffed near Siclos, taking their march towards Sigeth, he commanded a Detachement of German Horfe and Croats, under the Orders of Colonel Macari, and Major Orlich, to go in purluit of them, which they did with fo great diligence, that they overtook the Enemy within half a mile of Sigerb, and charging them, killed 120 upon the place, and put the reft to flight, who were fortunate enough to get into Sigeth, except two or three that were taken Prifoners ; These gave an account that this Party, which was composed of chosen Men, had Orders so soon as they had put the Money they were charged with into the hands of the Governor of Sigeth, to return towards Effecke. On our fide there were only killed in this Action an Officer of the Croats, and 5 or 6 Germans. These Letters and, That General Thingen had fent out feveral Spies, in order to attack the Enemy in their return to Effecke. And that the forementioned Con-. voy was not arrived at Five Churches the first of this month, but was hourly expected. The Letters from Upper Hungary tell us, that Major General Heusler was abroad with a firong Detachement to observe the Turks, who were waiting for an opportunity to conduct the Convoy they had prepared to Agria; And that Teckeley was at Temestoner, very much incommoded with the Wound he received in the late Rencounter he had with a Party of Dragoons of the Garifon of Segedin. The Letters from Lemberg in Poland of the 28th paft tell us, that the Court had been at Zolkieur fince the 22d of the fame month, where the Envoy from the Cham of Tartary had Audience of the King the fame day thefe Letters were written : And that the Polijh Troops had intercepted 40 Wagohs with Provi-fions which the Pealants in the Neighborhood of Caminiec were conducting to that place, induced thereunto by the great Rewards the Turks had promiled them for that Services

Hamburgh, Febr. 25. There is a Difcourfe of a Conference to be held at Altena about the Affairs of Holftein; and that the Elector of Brandenburgh has named the Sieur Smittau to be prefent at it on his part. The laft Letters from Postdam, which are of the 19th Instant, tell us, that the Count de Rayes Reve, who formerly commanded the Forces of Denmark, was then at that Court ; That the Recruits which his Electoral Highness had ordered to be raifed for the old Regiments were almost compleated: and that his Electoral Highnels was fending the Sicur Danckelman in the Quality of his Envoy to the Court at Vienna.

Cologne, Febr. 25. Prince Ferdinand of Furstemberg is gone to Licg", to meet the Cardinal his Unkle in his Return from France. The Levies that are making in these Parts for the Service of the Em-

peror advance with good fucces. Bruffe's, Febr. 28. Our Governor General will part from hence to morrow for Fianders, to fettle feveral Affairs with the States of that Province. The Letters from Madrid of the 13th Infant tell us, That the Marquis de Cogolludo was on his departufe for Rome, to relide there as Ambaffador Extraordinary from the Crown of Spain: And that the Reform of the supernumerary Officers of the several Councils had at last been put in execution, begin-ning with the Council of the Finances, in which above 70 Officers of Note have been reformed ; And that the Marquis de los Veles was made Surintendant General of the faid Council, a Title never given be-The last Letters from Vienna confirm the fore. account we had by our former, of the defeat of a Party of Turks near Sigeth, of whom 120 were killed upon the place.

Bruflets, March 4. The Prince de Berbanzon, Governor General of the Vrovince of Namur, is made Honorary Marefchal de Camp General of the Forces in these Countries; That is, he is to enjoy the Title and Pay, without exercising the Command. The departure of the New-Spain Fleet from Cadiz is put off till the beginning of April. The Letters from Vienna of the 20th past fay, they had received Advice from Upper Hungary, that the Grand Vifier had fent a great quantity of Provisions lader on 800 Camels, and feveral Wagons to Temefumer, with Orders to the Balla of that place to conduct them to Agria; And that having accordingly drawn together a Body of 6000 Turks and Tartars, with which Teckeley had joined fonte Hungarians, they had begun their march with this Convoy towards Giula, which Major General Heufler having no-tice of, he was gone with a ftrong Detache-ment to attack them: That the Turks had abandoned the Laftle of Sambocke, between Buda and Alba Regalis, into which the Imperia. As had put a Garifon, and that the great Convoy com Stiria was fafely arrived at Five Charbes. There are fome Letters that speak of the death of Teckeley, who, they fay, died at Temefinaer of the Wound he re-ceived in the late Action he was engaged in with the Imperialists but it needs a Confirmation.

Haine, Febr. 28. The States of Holland are still assembled, but have not yet confented to the ftate of the War for this prefent year; It's believed, they will in two or three days Adjourn till the mid-dle of the next month. Paris, March 5. The Count de Lobkowitz, Envoy Extraordinary from the Emperor, had yesterday a private Audience of the King at Verfailles. His Majefty went the fame day to Marli, where he in-tends to ftay till Saturday next. There are Letters from Spain which fay, they had News from the West-Indies, that the Pyrats, conducted by one Laurence, had plundered and burnt the Town of Panama, and put all the Inhabitants to Ranfom.
