MEDICAL REGISTRATION.

18, Bolton-street, Piccadilly-W., December 16, 1858.

NOTICE.

WHEREAS it is provided by the Medical Act, 21 and 22 Vict., cap. 90, Sect. 32— That "after the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, no person shall be entitled to recover any charge in any court of law for any medical or surgical advice, attendance, or for the performance of any operation, or for any medicine which he shall have both prescribed and supplied, unless he shall prove upon the trial that he is registered under this Act."

And by sec. 34—" After the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and fiftynine, the words 'legally qualified medical practitioner,' or 'duly qualified medical practitioner,' or any words importing a person recognised by law as a medical practitioner or member of the

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medical profession, when used in any Act of Parliament, shall be construed to mean a person registered under this Act."

And by sect. 36-" After the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and fiftynine, no person shall hold any appointment as a Physician, Surgeon, or other Medical Officer, either in the military or naval service, or in emigrant or other vessels, or in any hospital, infirmary, dispensary, or lying-in hospital, not supported wholly by voluntary contributions, or in any lunatic asylum, gaol, penitentiary, house of industry, parochial or union workhouse or poorhouse, parish union, or other public establishment, body, or institution, or to any friendly or other society for affording mutual relief in sickness, infirmity, or old age, or as a medical officer of health, unless he be registered under this Act."

And by sect. 37—" After the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and fiftynine, no certificate required by any Act now in force, or that may hereafter be passed, from any physician, surgeon, licentiate in medicine and surgery, or other medical practitioner, shall be valid, unless the person signing the same be registered under this Act."

And by sect. 40—"Any person who shall wilfully and falsely pretend to be, or take or use the name or title of a physician, doctor of medicine, licentiate in medicine and surgery, bachelor of medicine, surgeon, general practitioner or apothecary, or any name, title, addition, or description implying that he is registered (under this Act, or that he is recognised by law as a physician, or surgeon, or licentiate in medicine and surgery, or a practitioner in medicine, or an apothecary, shall, upon a summary conviction for any such offence, pay a sum not exceeding twenty pounds."

And whereas it is provided by sect. 15 of the Act, that it shall be lawful for the registrar to enter in the register the persons mentioned in the certified lists of the several colleges and bodies mentioned in schedule A, on payment of $\pounds 2$, notice is hereby given, that all persons requiring to be registered, may apply, personally or by letter, to the registrar, at No. 18, Boltonstreet, Piccadilly, London, W., between the hours of eleven a.m., and four p.m. Those who apply by letter, must state their names, places of residence, and the qualifications in respect of which they desire to be registered, and transmit to the registrar the fee of $\pounds 2$. And those who do not produce or send their diplomas or licenses, must furnish clear statements of their qualifications, and of the times at which they were granted, in order that these may be compared with the certified lists.

WARRANT ABOLISHING CERTAIN FEES IN THE COURTS OF QUEEN'S BENCH, COMMON PLEAS, AND EXCHEQUER.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the Session of Parliament, holden in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, chapter 73, intituled "An Act to make provision for a permanent establishment of Officers to perform the duties of Nisi Prius in the Superior Courts of Common Law, and for the payment of such Officers, and of the Judges' Clerks by salaries, and to abolish certain offices in those Courts," it was, amongst other things, enacted that it should and might be lawful for the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and they were thereby empowered and required, by and with the sanction of the Lords Chief Justices of the Courts of Queen's Bench and Common Pleas, and the Lord Chief Baron of the Exchequer, to abolish all or any of the fees received from Suitors by the Ushers, Court Keepers, Messengers, Assistants, and other subordinate Officers of the said superior Courts, and attendants on the Judges, other than the Judges' Clerks, and that a List or Lists specifying the nature or description of the fees so to be abolished shall thereupon be published by and under the authority of the said Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury in the London Gazette, provided that until such publication all Fees that now are or may be legally received in respect of such subordinate offices or appointments shall and may continue to be received as heretofore.

In pursuance of the said Statute We, being two of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, by and with the sanction of the Lords Chief Justices of the Court of Queen's Bench and Common Pleas and the Lord Chief Baron of the Exchequer, do hereby abolish, from the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, the undermentioned Fees hitherto taken from Suitors by the above-mentioned subordinate officers in the said superior Courts, which Fees have been set forth in the accounts of Fees rendered to the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury by such subordinate officers ; viz. :
