Is Excellency the hart of Tyrconnell Lord Deputy of Ireland Rading at his entrance upon this Government, that feveral falfe and malicious Reports and Infinuations were industriously spread among the People, to fill them with Fears and Jealoutics; His Excellency for the quieting the Minds of His Majulties Subjects, and affuring them of His Majellies Gracious Care for their Eafe and Advantage, and Protection in their just Rights and Properties. As likewife for the preferving His Majefties Forces in good Order and Dilcipline. And for the suppressing of Tories and Robbers, has issued the following Proclamations and Declaration.

Hereas We are informed that feveral dif-affected performs within this His Majefties Kingdom have been of late very industrious by fulle Reports, and malicious Infi-

nuations, to suggest to many of His Ma-julius Loyal Subjects, as if Ne His Majesties Chief Greenor intended to govern under His Majesty here other-Greenor intended to govern lineer His Majejty here other-nuife than by the known Law of this Land of Iyeland, and as if fome of His Mujefties Loyal Subjects flowed frand in bazard of being difturbed and di/quieted in their juft Liberties, Properties and other Rights due to them by Law, which Calimnics have been beighten'd and en-couraged by fonce few fiery Spirits in the Pulpits, by ta-king upon them to treat of Matters that do not lie with-dim their Parence for which Afterfions there may not insthest Province; for which Aspersions there was not the least ground, but the perverse Humor and wicked Principles of the Authors, since His Sacred Majesty bath given all His Subjects frequent affurances of His Gracious Refelutions to Govern them by Law, and to Protect them in their respective Properties and Priviledges according to Law; which Refolutions of His faid Maj fly He has given Us His Deputy in particular charge to obferve and Jignific to all His Subjects. For the removing therefore of all Fears and fealulies for the thinden is holes of lous Suggestions from the Hearts of His M jesties Sub-jests here, and for quicting the Minds of the People; And to the end that all His Majesties Good and Loyal Subjects may with cheerfulness apply themselves to their particular Concerns, Trade and Vocation; We the Lord Deputy and Council do hereby Publish and Declare, that We will, by the Grace of God, apply all Our Care and Industry to yield exact and perfect Obedience to H s Ma-seffects faid Commands; and do breeby Publish and De-clare in His Majestics behalf, that We shall take diligent Care that all His Majestics Subjects within this King-dom, of what Perstuation in Religion or Degree, what fo-ever they be, foall be Protected in their Just Rights and Described due as them he I am and an the foas Exercise ever they b:, fault be Protected in their Just Rights and Properties due to them by Law, and in the free Exercise of their Religion, provided they perfevere in their Duty and Allegiance to His Majefty, without giving any occa-jion of Disturbance to the Peace of the Kingdom. And for the further preferencion of the publick Peace of this Realm, We do Charge and Require all perfons whatfoever, to forbear speaking any undutified or increased expref-fons of His Majefties Sacred Perfon or Government. And We do require all His Majefties Judges, Justices, Magi-livates, and Officers, to take particular care that all perfrates, and Officers, to take particular care that all per-fous that fhall be different to be guilty of foreading linch foundations Reports, or using fuch maincions infinuations; fhall be projecuted according to the utmost rigor of the Law, To the end the just Punus committing the like upon them, may terrific others from committing the like Črime.

A DECLARATION.

TYRCONNELL.

TYR CONNELL. Hereas, We find it requifite for His Majellies Ser-vice, that the Porce. He is obliged to maintain, for the prefervation of the Peace of this Hig Kingdom, be kept in good Order and Difcipline? And, that His Subjects may not fuffer, by any Dif-order, or Misbehavior, of any Officer or Sol-dier, within His Pay and Entertainment: We have the ght fit hereby, to declare this Majelines Will and Pleafure; That in what, place foever, any of his Forces within this Kingdom full pals or remain, they thall duly pay their Quarters, at the ufual and agreed Rates; and fhall not, upon any pretence whatfoever x refule or avoid the fame. And, to the end, that all Diffuees, upon this Account, may be avoided; We do Command all Offi-cers, in their refpective Quarters, littictly to charge and publiking that the Soldiers do not exceed their ordinary weekly Allowance; and that no Innkeeper, Suttler, or other perion, prelime to give, them Credit for more; and that if any fhall trawfgreil. And, We do likewife Itrictly forbid, all Officers and Soldiers, to any perfon whatfoever; or, to give any other Offence, or jut canle of Complaint. And, in cale any of the faid Officers or Soldiers that the zoldiers do not exceed any of the faid Officers or Soldiers that further to commit any Spail, or Diford-r, or ufe any Vio-leace, threatning or reviling words, or otherwife misbehare themfore the commit any Spail, or Diford-r, or other and bin perform whatfoever; or the distoffect soldiers of Soldiers that prefume to commit any Spail, or Diford-r, or ufe any Vio-leace, threatning or reviling words, or otherwife misbehare themfore, so the exists and the fame to their superior Offi-cers, who are to caule Satisfaction to be made immediately to the perform injured. And if fuch Officer to whom Corplaint is jects, forthwith to make known the fame to their Superior Offi-cers, who are to caule Satisfactuonto be made immediately to the perfuns injured. And if fuch Officer to whom Complaint is made, fhall forbear or delay the caufing due Satisfaction to be given, as aforefaid; the perfons to whom the wrong is done, are then to prefent their Complaint to Us, that We may order fpeedy Juffice to be done them, by reparation of the Injury. And, by caufing the Officers or Soldiers, fo offending, to be forth-with Cafhiered, and fuch further Punifhments to be inflicted on them, as the nature and quality of their Offence fhall deferce. And, We do further Declare, that all Officers and Soldiers in their March, as well as in their Ouarters, fhall pay for whatever shey.

And, We do further Declare, that all Officers and Soldiers in their March, as well as in their Quarters, fhall pay for whatever skey, have, and fhall not demand, or exact Money for Quarters, have, and fhall dare to do the contrary, they thall be puni-fhed by Cashiering, and Lofs of their Pay: Ir being His Maje-flies Royal Intention and Command, that all Officers and Soldieff, in His service, behave themfelves orderly in alt shings. And whereas We are given to underliand, that leveral Officers of the Army do frequently ablent themfelves from their relip-chive Garilons; We do luereby Hriftly Charge and Require alf Officers to repair to their Quarters within ten days, there to re-fide, and take care from time to time, that the Soldiers under their Command, do their relipedive Duties punctually, as well in the Difeipline of War, as in their fober and peaceable demeance towards the relt of their Fellow Subjects, His Majetlies Liege People of thic Kingdom; that all manner of Prufarencia, and the effects of Idencis, Drinking, Whoring, Swearing, Curling, and other Debaueheries may be avoided. And We do further Require and Command, that all Officers

the effects of Identity, Drinking, Whoring, Swearing, Curing, and other Debaueleries may be avoided. And We do forther Require and Command, that all Officers and Soldiers from time to time, be aiding and allifting to the Ci-vil Magilirates, and Officers, in apprehending all Tories, Breakers of Houfes, Highway-Robbers, and other Notorious Malefactors, that have, or fhall at any time diffurb the Peace and Quiet of any of His Majellies Loyal Subjects. And to the end that none may plead ignorance of thefe Our Commands and Declaration; We do hereby firitly charge and require the Officer commanding in Chief in every Garifon, to publif them by Beat of Drum, to all the Soldiers drawn together. And We do alfo Command all Sheriffs, Mayors. Juffices of the Peace, and other Magilirates, to take Care to have thefe Our Orders made kaown to all Hi. Majelties other subjects ; it being' Our full and unalterable Refolution, to provide, in all things to the utmoth of Our Paw.r. for the mutual Amity and good Cor-refpondence of all Hi. Majelties Loving Subjects whatever, whê-ther Civil or Military within this Kingdom. Hereas a late Proclamation illied forth by the Lord Lieutenant and Counsil of this Kingdom in Desember last for the upprefing of Tories, Rob-bers, and their Harborers in the words follower ing.

W Hereas there have been of late many Burglaries and Rob We here a cheve there benefit in the many bergants and to the beries committed in feveral parts of this Kingdom, to the rulne of fome of His Majefties good Subjects, and to the great difquiet of many others; And it is found by experience, that His Majefties Mercy that hath been herecolore extended to Tome perfons that have been attainted of fuch Crimes, hath been an encouragement to others to commit the like. For the pre-vection therefore of fuch Offences for the future, and the taking eway all hopes of impusity from fuch as fhall hereafter be found Guilty thereof; We the Lord Lieutenant and Council have thought fit by this Our Proclamation, to Publish and Declare, that no Person or Persons who shall hereafter be Couviet or Atthat no Perion or Perions who infall hereaster be Convict or At-tainted of any Robbety or Burglary, are to expect any Pardon for the fame, or have the Favour of being Transported into any Forreign Plantation; but that the Law in all fuch cafes fkall be put in due Execution. And also that for the speedy Tryal of fuch Performs as thall be Apprehended for any fuch Crimes, We shall take care that special Commissions shall from time to time be three that purpole into luch Counties in this Kingdom where there fhall be occession for them.

And We do hereby further Require and Command, that the And We do hereby turiner sequire and commano, that the Laws of this Realm concerning the keeping of Watch and Ward, and for railing the Huc-and-Cry be duly obferved and executed; And that His Majulies Judges of Affize, and Jultices of Peace in the feveral Counties of this Kingdom do take care that fuch as Inall be found negligent thereio a so also the harborers of all no-torious Robbers and I clons be duly profecuted and proceeded araint againit,

And the feveral Juffices of Peace of this Kingdom are hereby alfo Required to be careful in taking fufficient Bail from fuch Of-fenders as thall be brought before them in all fuch Cafes, where by the Examinations taken by them they thall find juff reafon to find the balance because a sufficient of the Comes whereas Suffect or believe the Perions to be guilty of the Crimes whereof they fhall be accufed, and where luch Perfons are by Law Bail-able. And where any Perfons acculed of the like Crimes shall Hy from Juffice, or cannot be Apprehended, the faid Juffices of Peace are in lught cales to take Examinations concerning them, and return the fame to the dekt Affizes, to the end that they may thereupon be Indicted, which indictments are from time to time to be forthwith returned into His Maj. thes Court of Chief Place, to the end that the Offenders therein samed may be Outlawed thereupon. And all Commanders of Horfe and Foot, and all others His Majefiles Officers and loving Subjects are to be aiding and affilting in the due apprechenfion and bringing to Jullice of luch Perfume as shall be fulpected or accused of any Robberies glaries, as they and every of them will answer the contraor Burg ry at their perils.

Given at the Conneil-Chamber in Dublio the 8th day of De-cember, 1686.

Which Proclamation hath not yet met with the full Effect thereby intended, which has been much occalioned, as we are informed, by the carelefness and neglect of the Civil Magiltrates in their Duty.

We therefore the Lord Deputy and Council do hereby Require all Judges of Affice, Judices, Magiltrates, and all other His Ma-jetties Officers, to take diligent care that the faid Proclamation be duly obferved in all the patticulars thereof by them and every of them in their feveral flations.

And We do further Require the feveral Judges of Affize, in And We do further Require the leveral judges of Albze, in their refpective Circuits, to find our and Return to Us the Names of fuch of the Juffices of Peace, Magiffrates, and Officers, Ci-vil or Military, that fhall be found by them to have been any way refrectory or negligent in purfuing the Tenor of the faid Proclamation, to the end they and every of them may be dealg with according to the nature of their Offence. And We further Declare, That We do expect that fuch Per-

fors as will be infrumental in apprehending any of the faid To-ries, Robbers, and notorious Malefactors, in order to the bring-ing of them to condign punilament, shall be encouraged for meir Good Services.

Lemberg, Febr. 3. The King is returned to this place from Zolkiem, and intends to continue here till towards the end of this month. Vienna, Feb. 27. The Elector of Bavaria is expected here in his return from Venice, to affift at a great Council of War which will be held to deliberate about the Operations of the next Campagne. We have an account from Buda, that the Parties that had been fent from thence towards Alba Regalis, were returned with leveral hundred head of Cattle, which they had taken from ander the Cannon of that place, after having fet the neighbouring Villages under Contribution. The fame Letters fay, that fome perfons that were come to Buda from Siclos, reported that the Turks had furprized the Palanque Mohatz on the Danube, near Effecke, in which were 130 Hungarians, who were all put to the Sword. The Mojcovite Ambaffadors are, it's faid, arrived on the Frontiers of Silefia.

Cologne, March 7. The Letters from Bafle give an account that the Conde de Villar Mayor, Ambaffador Ex-traordinary from the King of Portugal to the Elector Palatin arrived there the 25th of the last Month. The Magistrates made him a Present of Wine, according to their antient Cuftome; And at his departure from thence on the 27th, he was faluted with the Cannon of the place, and by the Burghers who were in Arms, with other expressions of Respect.

Hague, March 11. Her Royal Highness the Princess of Orange parted from hence yetlerday morning for Dieren, Prince Waldecke is gone to visit the Garifon of Maeftricht of which Place he is Governor. The States of Holland will re-atlemble to morrow,

Deal, March 4. Yesterday came into the Downs two great Dutch Ships bound for the East-Indies, and another bound for Surinam, being forced in by a S.S.W. Wind, which blew very fresh: The last of these has lost her Main Matt by one of the Eaft-India Ships running on board her.
