Dublin, Feb. 26. Is Excellency the Earl of Tyrconnell Lord Deputy of Ireland Ending at his entrance upon this Government, that several false

and malicious Reports and Infinuations were industriously spread among the People, to fill them with Fears and Jealonfies; Lis Excellency for the quieting the Minds of His Majesties Subjects, and affuring them of His Majetlies Gracious Care for their Ease and Advantage, and Protection in their just Rights and Properties. As likewise for the preserving His Majesties Forces in good Order and Discipline. the suppressing of Tories and Robbers, has issued the following Proclamations and Declaration.

By the Lord Deputy and Council. TYRCONNELL.

Hereas We are informed that several disaffected persons within this His Majesties Kingdom have been of late very industrious by fulse Reports, and malicious Insinuations, to suggest to many of His Ma-justics Loyal Subjects, as if We His Majesties Chief Greenor intended to govern under His Majesty here other-Greener intended to govern lineer His Majejty here other-nife than by the known Law of this Land of Iyeland, and as if some of His Majesties Loyal Subjects should stand in hazard of being disturbed and disquieted in their just Liberties, Properties and other Rights due to them by Law, which Calomius have been heighten'd and en-couraged by some few stery Spirits in the Pulpits, by ta-king upon them to treat of Matters that do not lie with-dividual Property for which. After some there was not in their Province; for which Aspersions there was not the least ground, but the percerse Humor and wicked Principles of the Authors, since His Sacred Majesty bath given all His Subjects frequent affurances of His Gracious Refolutions to Govern them by Law, and to Protect them in their respective Properties and Priviledges according to Law; which Resolutions of His Said Maj fly He has given Us His Deputy in particular charge to observe and Jignific to all His Subjects. For the removing therefore of all Fears and Jealousies proceeding from such scandalous Suggestions from the Hearts of His M jesties Subjects here, and for quicting the Minds of the People; And to the end that all His Majesties Good and Loyal Subjects may with cheerfulness apply themselves to their particular Concerns, Trade and Vocation; We the Lord Deputy and Council do hereby Publish and Declare, that We will, by the Grace of God, apply all Our Care and Industry to yield exast and perfect Obedience to H s Majesties said Commands; and do breely Publish and Deciare in His Majesties behalf, that We shall take diligent
Care that all His Majesties Subjects within this Kingdom, of what Perswalion in Religion or Degree, what so
ever they be, shall be Protected in their Just Rights and Properties due to them by Law, and in the free Exercise of their Religion, provided they persevere in their Duty and Allegiance to the Majesty, without giving any occasion of Disturbance to the Peace of the Kingdom. And for the further preservation of the publick Peace of this Realm, We do Cha ge and Require all persons whatsoever, to forbear speaking any industrictor increases of extress. to forbear speaking any undutiful or irreverend expressions of His Majesties Sacred Person or Government. And We do require all Hu Majesties Judges, Justices, Magifrates, and Officers, to take particular care that all per-fons that shall be discovered to be graity of spreading such scandalous Reports, or using such malicious sussinations; shall be projecuted according to the utmost rigor of the Law, To the end the just Punishment to be inslicted upon them, may terrisse others from committing the like Crime.

A DECLARATION.

TYRCONNEL L. Hereas, We find it requifite for His Majesties Service, that the Porce He is obliged to maintain, for the preservation of the Peace of this His

vice, that the Porces He is obliged to maintain, for the prefervation of the Peace of this His Kingdom, be kept in good Order and Discipline? And, that His Subjects may not suffer, by any Diforder, or Misbehavior, of any Officer or Soldier, within His Pay and Entertainment: We have theight shereby, to declare His Maj. slies Will and Pleasure; That in what place soever, any of his Porces within this Kingdom shall pass or remain, they shall duly pay their Quarters, at the usual and agreed Rates; and shall not, upon any pretence whatsoever a refuse or avoid the same. And, to the end, that all Disputes, upon this Account, may be avoided; We do Command all Officers, in their respective Quarters, strictly to charge and publishe that the Soldiers do not exceed their ordinary weekly Allowance; and that no Innkeeper, Suttler, or other person, presume to give them Credit for more; and that if any shall transgress. herein, We shall not hold Our Selves obliged to see them satisfied. And, We do likewise strictly forbid, all Officers and Soldiers, to any person whatsoever; or, to give any other Offence, or just cause of Complaint. And, in case any of the said Officers or Soldiers shall presume to commit any Spoil, or Disorder, or use any Violence, threatning or reviling words, or otherwise misbelave. Themselves; We do hereby require, all His Majesties loving Subsjects, forthwith to make known the same to their Superior Officers, who are to cause Satissaction to be made immediately to the pressus injured. And is substituted to the Complaint is jects, forthwith to make known the same to their Superior Officers, who are to cause Satisfaction to be made immediately to the persons injured. And if such Officer to whom Complaint is made, shall forbear or delay the causing due Satisfaction to be given, as aforesaid; the persons to whom the wrong is done, are then to present their Complaint to Us, that We may order speedy Justice to be done them, by reparation of the Injury. And, by causing the Officers or Soldiers, so offending, to be forthewith Cashiered, and such surther Punishments to be institled on them, as the nature and quality of their Offence shall deserve, And, We do further Declare, that all Officers and Soldiers in their Officers are such as well as in their Officers.

And, We do further Declare, that all Officers and Soldiers in their March, as well as in their Quarters, shall pay for whatever they, have, and shall not demand, or exact Money for Charter, and that if any shall dare to do the contrary, they shall be purished by Cashiering, and Loss of their Pay: Ir being His Majessites Royal Intention and Command, that all Officers and Soldiers, in His service, behave themselves orderly in all things.

And whereas We are given to understand, that several Officers of the Army do frequently absent themselves from their respective Garisons; We do hereby Brickly Charge and Require all Officers to repair to their Quarters within ten days, there to reside, and take care from these to time, that the Soldiers under their Command, do their respective Duties punctually, as well in the Discipline of War, as in their sober and peaceable demeanne towards the rest of their Fellow Subjects, His Majesties Liege People of this Kingdom; that all manner of Prusarencia, and the effects of Idencis, Drinking, Whoring, Swearing, Cursing, and other Debaucheries may be avoided.

And We do further Require and Command, that all Officers

and other Debaucheries may be avoided.

And We do further Require and Command, that all Officers and Soldiers from time to time, be aiding and affitting to the Civil Magiltrates, and Officers, in apprehending all Tories, Breakers of Houses, Highway-Robbers, and other Notorious Malefactors, that have, or shall at any time diffurb the Peace and Quiet of any of His Majetties Loyal Subjects. And to the end that none may plead ignorance of these Our Commands and Declaration; We do hereby strictly charge and require the Officer commanding in Chief in every Garison, to publish them by Beat of Drum, to all the Soldiers drawn together.

And We do also Command all Sherists, Mayors. Justices of the Peace, and other Magistrates, to take Care to have these Our Orders made known to all His Majetties other subjects; it being to the utmost of Our Power, for the murual Amity and good Correspondence of all His Majetties Loving Subjects whatever, whether Civil or Military within this Kingdom.
