The same Decree exempts from import duties the following articles:-

Ornamental plumes of vulture's or cock's feathers.

Zeeland Linseed, for sowing, imported in casks (fûts enrobés), in French vessels.

Cabinet woods of any sort, except those from the French colonies and from Senegal, in billets, blocks or sawn, of more than two décimètres in thickness, imported in French vessels from countries out of Europe.

Wood for building purposes, imported in French vessels, hewn or sawn, of more than 80 millimètres in thickness, except walnut wood sawn in planks or slabs.

Cochineal, from the French colonies.
