IS Majefty being informed that feveral Sums of Money Collected for the Relief of the Diftreffed French Protestants, pursuant to the Letters Patents of His Late Majefty of Ever B'effed Memory, dated the 1 oth dry of December 1681, are jtill remaining in the Hands of feveral Persons who were apprinted to Collect and Pay in the fame. His Majefty in Council was thereupon pleafed to Order, And it is bereby Ordered, That fuch Perfons in whose Hands any of the Money Collected as aforefaid doth remain, do forthwith cause the fame to be paid into the Chamber of London, seconding to the directions of the faid Letters Parents; And the Commission of the faid Letters Parents is And the Commission Majefties Letters for the French Protestants by His Majefties Letters Parents bearing date- the 5th day of March 1685, are bereby Authorized and Impowered to dispose of the faid Money.

Lezharne, Febr. 15. Four Gallies and as many Galiots are fitting out by Order of our Great Duke, to ferve against the Turks the next Summer. By a Veffel arrived in this Port from Conftantinople we have advice, That the Grand Signior was at Adviahople, and that it was fill given out (to encourage the Soldiery) that he will the next Campagne command in Perfon his Forces in Hungary. That the By's Gallies and 17 Men of War were returned to Conftantinople in a very ill Condition; And that the Plague continued to rage there very vioiently.

Venice, Febr. 22. The t6th Inftant, the Ele-Stor of Bavaria was in the Great Council, to fee the manner of giving their Voices; The next day he went to fee the Arfenal, where he was received by four Nobles appointed by the Senate to accompany him. He faw likewife the new Ships that have been built here this Winter; And went afterwards fome Leagues to Sea in a fmall Frigat, on Board of which he was entertained with a Noble Collation, After his Return, he went to fee the Baffa of Napali di Romania, and the other Baffa his Brother, who received him with many expressions of Respect. It's faid his Electoral Highnels has promiled to affish this Republick with a Regiment of Horfe, which is to ferve in the Morea the next Campagne, and that a Gentleman has been dispatched to Municke with Orders for the faid Regiment to be-

gin forthwith their march. The Duke of Savor (who' is here Incognica) has likewife feen what's moft Curious in this City. The 18th, he went to fee the Palace, where he was entertained with a Banquet of Sweet Meats, Sc. by Order of the Republick; And the next day had the divertifement of the ufual Combat between the Caftellans and the Nicolotes. This week arrived here 2 Veffels from the Morea, by which we have no other News, than that Signior Venier, Captain Extraordinary of the Ships of this State, was gone to Cruize with five or fix Men of War in the Archipelage; And that the Seralquier of the Morea was returned to Corinche, after having reinforced the Garifons of Patras and Lepanto

Warlaw, Febr. 15. The Bilhop of Primiflia, Amballador Extraordinary from this Grown to the Emperor, has begun his Journey to Vienna; From whence, as we are told, he is to go with the fame Character to Rome and Venice. The laft Letters from Lemberg told us, that the Envoy of Tareary was fill there, but that he would be feat away in few days with this Anlyer. That the King having ratified the League with the Czars of Molcow, he is not now at Liberty to receive any Proposals. of Peace, in which their Satisfaction as well as that of his other Allies is not included. The Advices from Molcow give an account, that the Czars will have 120000 Men in the Field the next Summer, under the Command of Knees Galarzin their chief Minifter; And that the General Rendezvous is appointed to be in the Month of April near Smor lensko.

Vienna, March 2. The News of Teckeley's death is not confirmed, but on the contrary the last Letters from *Opper Hungary* faid, they had advice that he was very well at *Temefinaer*, and that they believed he himfelf had caufed the Report first of his being dangerously wounded, and afterwards of his death, to be purposely spread abroad, to make the Imperialifts lefs watchful on that fide, that fo he might have a better opportunity to relieve Agria. They write from Buda, That the Detachement which was lately fent towards Alba Re-galis, had brought back with them 27 Priloners; having defeated a Party of Turks belonging to that Garilon commanded by a Nephew of the Balla, who, with many more, was killed upon the place. That these Prisoners reported, that there was in Alba Regalis a Garifon of 5000 Men, but that they fuffered very much through the want of Provisions: The same Letters add, That the Fortifications of Buda are so well repaired, that the Place is in a condition to suftain a Siege: That so soon as the Fraft was broke, a Bridge would be made over the, Danube between Buda and Pest, for a more easie Communication with the Imperial Troops quar-tered on that fide; And that a great Magazine was providing at Buda for the Sublitence of the Imperial Troops during the next Campagne.
