Venice, March 8. E have Letters from Conftantinople of the 4th of the last month, which give an Account, That the Grand Vifier feeing the Overtures he had made for the fetting on foot a Treaty

of Peace rejected by the Emperor, had refolved to make his utmost effort to appear the next Campagne at the head of a numerous Army; And that to raile Mony(of which there was a great want) for the carrying on the War, the Grand Signior had demanded Supplies from his People; And first he fent to the Cadeleskers and Mulha's, who an-fwered by the Month of Hamid Effendi ( Cadelesker of Rumelia in the time of the Vifier Cara Mustapha) That it was a thing without example to make them contribute to the War, who received nothing from the publick Treasury, faying, Those that were Favourites, and had great Offices, and managed the Revenues, ought to be called up-on to affilt the Publick; Which so offended the Grand Signior, that Hamid was immediately banish'd to Cyprus; However, the Cadeleskers and Mulha's were excused from any Contribution. But all Baffa's, Aga's, and other confiderable Men, and rich Merchants the Grand Signior's Subjects, were to contribute according to their feveral Abilities; Which was to pass through the whole Empire, and would, 'twas believed, raife at leaft a Sum of 20 thousand Purses, which is about two Millions ster-ling, a Fond sufficient for this years Expense. That Orders were likewife fent through the whole Empire for the raifing of Soldiers, wiz. 10000 Bof-miacks and Albane/es, and 30000 Kiurts and Arabs, and the Militia of Egypt; And that Officers were alfo fent to make Levies in Barbary. That the News of the Mofcovites entring into the League very much troubled the Turks. And the Transilvanians not fending their annual Tribute made them doubt of their Fidelity.

Venice, March 8. We have Advice by a Veffel arrived from Malta, that 8 Gallies are fitting out there to ferve against the Turks, on which there will Embark 100 Knights of Malta, and 1000 Land Soldiers. The Duke of Savoy parted from hence this week on his Return to Turin.

Madrid, Febr. 27. The Queen was indifpoled the laft Week, having had two or three light Fits of an Ague, but her Majefty is at prefent perfectly well again. The Marquis de Cogolludo will now vesy speedily begin his Journey to Rome, where he is to refide as Ambasflador Extraordinary from this Crown. The Count de Melgar is at Liberty, but cannot yet obtain leave to come to Court. We have an account of fome Diforders that had happened in Galicia near Salvatierra, but they were prefently appeafed. Don Emanuell de Colomna is preparing for his departure, being Named by his Catholick Majefty to be his Envoy Extraordinary to the *States-General* of the United Provinces.

Lemberg, Febt. 18. All things are preparing here for an early Campagne ; And Orders have been given for the providing a great number of Bombs, Granadoes, and Carcalles, which makes us think there is a defign to attack *Caminiec*, or fome other important place. Yefterday were brought hither 17 Tartars, with 2 Colours, and 12 very fine Horfes, which were lately taken by fome of our Troops in a Rencounter they had with the Enemy near Ramanoma. These Prisoners say, that the Cham of Tartary understanding the League between this Crown and the Czars of Moscovy was ratified, had written to the Grand Visier to acquaint him with it, and to let him know that he could not fend any of his Forces to join with those of the Grand Signior, fince he must now employ them to fecure his own Countries against the Invalions of the Moscovites. The Envoy from the Chain is still here, and con. tinues his Endeavors to dispose this Court to a Treaty of Peace; And though he has been told that the Sing is under fuch Engagements that he cannot be-gin it without the confent of his Allies, yet because we have advice that Sultan Galga has drawn a great Body of Tartar's together to make an Incurfion into Podolia, fo foon as he hears that the faid Envoy is difpatched from hence with a diffatisfactory Anfwer, he is fuffered to remain here, with fome hopes of fucceeding in his Negotiation, till the Crown Treafurer, who is commanded to march with 4000 men towards the Frontiers, and to join the Troops that are quartered there, is in a condition to oppose the faid Sultan Galga, who, we are told, has with him about 8000 Men. Their Majefties intend to return

in a day or two to Zolkiew. Dantzick, March 4. The Advices from Poland tell us, That great Preparations are making in that Kingdom against the next Campagne; That the King had fent Orders to all his Troops to be in a readine's to march by the first of May. And that his Majefties Intention was to keep Caminiec very closely blocked up (the Garifon of which place is very much weakened, and in great want of Provisions ) while He acted with the main Body of his Forces in concert with the Mascovites. They write from Moscow, That the Czars had re-folved to fend Ambaffadors to England, France, Spain, and Holland, to notifie the League they had concluded with the Crown of Poland aganift the Turks, and defire Affiftance: And that the faid Arthaffadors would begin their Journey in April hext. The fame Letters add, That the Czars will certainly have a very numerous Army in the Field the next Summer, and that Knees Galuzen, their chief Favourite, is appointed to command it, who, for his own Honor, as well as the Service of his Mafters.

Mafters, does now apply his whole Care to advance the Preparations for the War. Vienna, March 9. We have an Account by

Letters of the 6rh Inftant from Buda, That Major-General Becke; Governor of that Place, had difcovered a Correspondence which one Finckenftein, an Officer of the Regiment of Solme, had with the Baffa of Alba Regalis, who being thereupon apprehended, confessed upon his Examination, that he had treated with the Enemy, but that he did it with an Intention to have got a Sum of Money of them, and then to have himfelf discovered their defign; For the execution whereof it was agreed that a confiderable Body of Turks thould advance as on Monday laft towards Buda. The Garifonsthat they, might be in a readiness to receive them, were Nightiand Day in Arms. The Letters from Upper Humpury confirm what we told you in our laft, of the discovery of the Intelligence Teckeley had in Efperies and Bartfelt, and that feveral of the principal Inhabitants who were concerned in it had been feized. The Mofcopire Amballadors are expected here the beginning of the nextweek. Four Deputies are come hither from the States of Croatia. On Wednesday last the goung Princes was Christned by Cardinal Bonosti the Pope's Nuncio at this Court, affifted by the Bishop of this City, and the Bishop of Nitria, be-ing named Maria, Josepha, Antonia. Dresden, March 10. The Count de Clari, En-

voy Extraordinary from the Emperor, has had feveral Conferences with the Ministers of this Courf. concerning the Succors which our Elector offers to

fond to the Emperor's Affiltance. Cologue, March 18. We are told from Rating bonne, That the Emperor has demanded of the States of the Empire affembled there, a Supply of toa Raman Months for the War against the Turks; And that the feveral Colledges would in few days take the fame into confideration. We have Advice that the Conde de Villan Mayor, Amballador 'Extraordinary from the King of Portugal to the Elector Palatin, is arrived at Spire ; And that great Preparations are making for his Reception at Heydelberg: They write from Strasbourgh, That the new Forts) which the French are making at the Bridge of Hummingen, and in the Ille of Germe-fheim, will be finished in a short time. The Cardinal of Furftemberg is expected the next week at Linge, in his return from the Court of France.

Handburgh, March 15. The Letters from Poll-dum of the 12th Inftant tell us, the Envoy from the Crown of Poland had the day before Audience of the Elector of Brandenburgh, his Buline's being to demand Succors against the Turks, which his Electoral Highnels has taken time to confider of. The Levies are continued in these Parts for the compleating the Regiment which is to ferve in the Morea the next Summer under the Command of Punce Maximilaan of Brunfivicke.

Roermont, March 18. The Marquis de Gostasuga, Governor-General of the Spanish Netherlands, arrived here yesterday in the afternoon, having been received feveral Miles from hence by the Prince of Naffan our Governor, and the Cavalry of this Garifon. His Excellency has demanded 120 thousand Florins of the States of this Province, who are now allembled'; He intends in a day or two to return to Bruffels.

Hague, March 21. The Prince of Orange arfived here the 19th Instant from Dieren, whither his Highness intends to return again in two or three days. The States of Friefland have confented to the flate of the War for this prefent year. Those of this Province are not yet agreed about the ex-Thole traordinary Impositions, and it's believed they will adjourn till after the Holidays, without taking a final Refolution in this matter. We hear from Vi emma, that a Captain of the Galifon of Buda ha held a Correspondence with the Tinks, in order t put that place into their hands, fur, that the Trea fon had been happily difference, and the Office fecured.
