John Williams, formerly of Brynulan, in the parish of Llanrhaidr yn Cimmerch, in the county of Denbigh, Labourer, and trading in the several market towns in the counties of Anglesea, Carnarvon, Denbigh, Flint, Merioneth, and Montgomery, in copartnership with John Rowlands, of Bryn, in the parish of Llanrhaidr yn Cimmerch aforesaid, Farmer, as Cattle, Sheep, and Pig Dealers, then of Brynulan aforesaid, in copartnership with Hannah Davies, of Bryn aforesaid, Widow (executrix of the last will and testament of the said John Rowlands, deceased) as Cattle and Sheep Dealers, and then of Brynulan aforesaid, Labourer, and Cattle, Sheep, and Pig Dealer, and sometimes attending fairs in the several market towns in the counties of Anglesea, Carnarvon, Denbigh, Flint, Merioneth, and Montgomery, and buying and selling Cattle, Sheep, and Pigs, then residing in Love-lane, in the town of Denbigh, in the said county of Denbigh, trading in copartnership with Jiles Wynne, of the Vicarage, Llanrhaidr yn Cimmerch aforesaid, Farmer, as Cattle, Sheep, and Pig Dealers, then of Love-lane, in the town of Denbigh aforesaid, Labourer, Cattle, Sheep, and Pig Dealer, and sometimes attending fairs in the several market towns in the counties of Anglesea, Carnarvon, Denbigh, Flint, Merioneth, and Montgomery, and buying and selling Cattle, Sheep, and Pigs, afterwards of Love-lane, in the town of Denbigh aforesaid, Labourer, and trading in copartnership with Hugh Jones, of College Farm, in the parish of Henllan, in the said county of Denbigh, Farmer, as Cattle Dealers, and then of Love-lane, in the town of Denbigh aforesaid, Labourer, and Cattle Drover, and sometimes attending fairs in the several market towns in the counties of Anglesea, Carnarvon, Denbigh, Flint, Merioneth, and Montgomery, and buying and selling Cattle in copartnership with the said Hugh Jones.

N.B.—1. If any Creditor intends to oppose a Prisoner's discharge notice of such intention must be given to the said Prisoner, in writing, which may be left at the Gaol two clear days before the day of hearing above mentioned, exclusive of Sunday, and exclusive both of the day of giving such notice and of the said day of hearing.

2. The petition and schedule will be produced by the proper Officer for inspection and examination at the Office of the Court in London, between the hours of Eleven and Three, on this notice being exhibited; and copies of the petition and schedule, or such part thereof as shall be required, will be provided by the proper Officer, according to the Act of 1st and 2nd Victoria, cap. 110, sec. 105.

3. The duplicates of the petitions and schedules, and all books, papers and writings filed therewith, will be produced by the Clerks or Assistant Clerks of the said County Courts, for inspection and examination, at the Offices of the said County Courts respectively, at the Towns aforesaid, and copies of the petition and schedule, or such part thereof as shall be required, will be provided according to sec. 106 of the Act.
