That the Czars had taken feveral Foreign Officers into their Service, and had fent to Germany and other pairs for more; and that the common difcourfe was, they would have 200 000 Men in the Field the next Summer, which are to be commanded by Kneas Gal. 27 in their chief Minister and Favorite. They write fiber *Poland*, that great Preparations are likewife making in that kingdom, and that the Forces are appointed to be at the general Rendezvous, about the middle of May. There are Letters from Lembergh of the first of this month, which fay, That a great Convoy of Provifions' and Ammunition, with a new Baffa, was arrived at Continuec, under the Guard of 20000 Tastari, The Polish Coult is expected the next lisofull ar Warfam.

Hamburgh, March 18. That leveral Conferences have lately been held there between the Ministers of the Dukes of Lunenburgh, and these of divers other Prinres; after which, the Duke of Zell went from mence to b's handen, to take the Divertifement of Hunting for 8 or 10 days. The fame Advices fay, That the Sient Schultz was returning home from France, without having concluded any thing in the matters he was fent to negotiate at that Court. The Letters from Drefden of the fame date tell us, That the Baron de Gortz, Envoy from the Duke of Ho ftein Gottorpe was areiv'd there, and had had Audience of his Electoral Highnels. We are told from Post dam, Fhat the Elector of Brandenburgh had not yet given a final Answer to the Demand made by the Poinfh Envoy of Succors against the Turks. Great Preparations are making at that Court for the Marriage of the Prince of Mecklenburg with the Princels of Brandenburgh.

Cologie, March 20.
