

That in place of the two scholarships founded in accordance with the said indenture, there be established in the said college one exhibition of the yearly value of seventeen pounds and ten shillings.

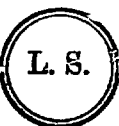
That the first election to the said exhibition take place in Michaelmas Term, 1859.

That the rights of preference to election, and the mode of election, as prescribed in the said indenture for the two scholarships, be continued in all respects the same for the said exhibition.

That any person elected into the said exhibition be eligible for any scholarship, sizarship, or other college emolument; and that, in the event of his being elected, the exhibition be tenable with such scholarship, sizarship, or other college emolument.
