STATUTE LVIII.

Of Notice.

Every Fellow shall, upon or immediately after his admission, and may from time to time afterwards, leave with such officer as the Master and Seniors shall appoint, a place of address to which all notices intended for him are to be sent; and in all cases in which, by these Statutes, notice is required to be given to any Fellow, it shall be sufficient that the notice be sent to his last address by post or otherwise.

In any case in which notice is required to be given to the Master, it shall be sufficient that the notice be left at the Master's lodge.

STATUTE LIX.

Power of Altering the Statutes.

The College Seal shall not be affixed to any instrument for the repeal, alteration, or amendment of these Statutes, or any part of them, in pursuance of the provisions of the Act 19 & 20 Vict. cap. 88., without a General Meeting having previously been held of the Master and Fellows of the College, at which the Majority of the whole body of the Master and Fellows of the College shall have ordered the Seal to be so affixed.
