THE Queen has been graciously pleased to appoint Charles Lennox Wyke, Esq., now Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires and Consul-General to the Republics of Guatemala, Nicaragua, Costa Rica, Honduras, and Salvador, to be Her Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary, on a special mission to those Republics.

By virtue of an Act passed in the twenty-fourth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to repeal so much of two Acts made in the tenth and fifteenth years of the reign of His present Majesty, as authorises the Speaker of the House of Commons to issue his warrant to the Clerk of the Crown for making out writs for the election of Members to serve in Parliament, in the manner therein mentioned, and for substituting other provisions for

the like purposes," I do hereby nominate, appoint, and authorise, the Honourable Harry George Vane, commonly called Lord Harry Vane, the Right Honourable Thomas Henry Sutton Sotheron Estcourt, Colonel John Wilson Patten, William Battie Wrightson, Esquire, and Thomas William Bramston, Esquire, being Members of the House of Commons, or any one or more of them, to execute all and singular the powers given to the Speaker of the House of Commons for the time being, for issuing warrants to the Clerk of the Crown, in cases as in the said Act specified.
